CHOLERA PREVENTIVE COSTUME.

He who would defend himself from the Contagious Cholera must be dressed in the following Manner. The Bust to be entirely covered with India rubber, on which apply a large Fitch Plaster, and cover the whole with a Flannel six Yards long. Fut a Copper-Flate on the Fit of the Stomach and on the Breast a Bag of warm sand. Around the neck place a double band, filled with Popper & Junper Berries Fill the Ears with Cotton impregnated with Camphin. Suspend to the Nose a large vial of concentrated vinegar, and adjust a Braneb of acrous before the mouth. Over the band which surrounds the Body wear a Shirt saturated with oblorine's of Linne, a cotton waistcoal. It a Locket impregnated also with chlorinet of Linne Flannel trowsers, thread Stockings dipped in vinegar, over which another pair of worsted, rubbed with camphire. Hollow brass soles con-stantly filled with warm water, and strong shoes Belinni the Caives should be suspended two title Pitchers till of water. He must were besides a great coat a worsted goun, and cover the whole with a large cleak of oil dolb, a bat of the same stuff, and the face to be covered with a paste mask. In the right great coat pocket a pound of perfumed tea, and buff a pound of feluent root. In the left pocket a pound of oriender root, and half a pound of sage last. In the jacket pocket a vial of essence of camomile and in the fob a vial of camphorated ether. In the crown of the hat a basin of soup, in the right band a bush of juniper tree, and in the left an acasa time.
