How to get help after AIR RAID DAMAGE

FOOD AND REST CENTRES provide temporary shelter for those whose houses are uninhabitable and who have not gone to friends or relatives.



INJURY ALLOWANCES. For workers injured in air-raids, and for Civil Defence Volunteers injured on duty, unable to work because of their injuries.

COMPENSATION. Immediate help for immediate needs: loss of clothes, furniture, tools, etc. made good in certain circumstances.

PAID THROUGH THE ASSISTANCE BOARD



PENSIONS for Widows and Dependent Relatives of workers and Civil Defence Volunteers who are killed or die from their injuries are granted in certain circumstances.

PAID BY THE MINISTRY OF PENSIONS

DAMAGED HOUSES. First-aid repairs to make them wind and weather tight.

DONE FREE BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITY



REMOVALS OR STORAGE OF FURNITURE
from damaged houses.

REHOUSING AND BILLETING

**HELP CAN BE GIVEN BY THE LOCAL
AUTHORITY**
