DIRECTIONS FOR OUTWARD APPLICATION.

Shake the Bottle and rub it in well twice a day. For the WORMS in SHEEP occasioned by the FLY, pour a little into the wound and rub the part affected twice a day.

DIRECTIONS FOR USING AS A DRENCH.

In cases of INFLAMMATIONS, GRIPES, &c.—For a HORSE or a COW, half a pint to be given in a quart of Gruel or Flax Seed Tea. For Scour in CALVES, one-third or half the above quantity according to age. Dose for a SHEEP, two table-spoonfuls; a YOUNG LAMB, a tea-spoonful, or two, according to its age, in Warm Gruel or Flax Seed Tea.
