The trip from Poland used to take 20 days, until an outcry after 15 horses were found frozen to death in a railway truck, so old it still had bullet holes from the war.

Some dealers, sending live horses overseas for slaughter, "think of horses like secondhand cars," says JAYNE.

"Horses were packed in. If one wanted to turn round they all had to turn round"

Welfare workers have found horses and ponies crowded together in containers without partitions, some dehydrated, some injured, and with dying and dead animals trampled by the others.

One officer saw a sick horse swung off a boat by ropes just tied around its hind legs.
