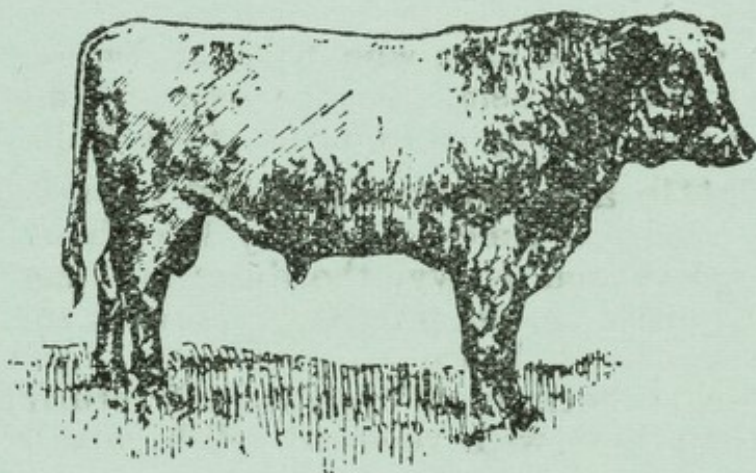

CONDITIONING STOCK

Nothing is so heart-breaking to the stock owner as a **Waster or Bad-doer**. It takes more food than a better animal and yet never looks well; it costs more and is worth less. Many causes contribute to this state of affairs, but in the majority of cases, the use of **Cupiss' Constitution Balls** will cause the animal to put on flesh in a manner surprising to one who has not before seen the effects produced by them, and the user will find himself repaid, over and over again, the cost of the Balls.

When **Cattle are being Fattened** for sale or show there often comes a time when they lose their appetite, become sluggish and heavy, the dung is slimy and the beasts make little or no progress. Now is the time to administer a dose of the Constitution Balls, and the effect will be magical; the animals' appetite will return and they will take their food with renewed relish, with the result that improvement in condition and increase in size will very soon be noticeable. The Balls tone up the digestive organs, enabling them to more effectually extract the nutritive qualities of the food and thus the animals fatten much faster than would otherwise be the case, and, consequently, at a less cost.

For **Dairy Cattle** the Constitution Balls are excellent. An occasional dose given to a Cow in milk will increase the flow, and if given to a cow with calf by side the good effect of the ball will be seen in both. A thin watery fluid runs from the nose, which is hard and dry, and often from the eyes, which lose their brightness, and a slight rise in the animal's temperature follows.


Keep the animal warm and dry, and administer a dose of **Cupiss' Constitution Balls** every fourth day.

| Calf 3 months old | Three-fourths-of-a-Ball. |
| Calf 3 or 4 weeks old | Half-a-Ball. |

The best way of giving the Ball to Neat Cattle is to beat it on a stone into a coarse Powder and mix in a pint of **COLD Gruel** and give as a Drench.

 **In case of Scouring, the Animal should be kept from Water as much as possible and have Gruel instead.**

Wasting or Pining of Farm Stock

The animal which pines away without apparent cause is a source of anxiety, worry and, eventually, loss to its owner.

It falls away in flesh, loses its appetite, becomes enfeebled and often feverish, which is a bad sign, and finally dies or has to be destroyed.

Hoven, Blown or Tympanitis

Immediate treatment—

2dr. Chloride of Lime mixed with 1 quart of water.

Give as a drink.

To prevent a recurrence give drier food, and an occasional dose of **Cupiss' Constitution Balls**.

I give a Ball-and-a-half to Neat Stock when Blown, and repeat at the end of the week, and have never known an animal to blow a second time.

Milk Fever.—A dose of Constitution Balls should be given to Cows shortly before calving to allay any tendency towards this disease. A dose may also be given after calving, which will benefit both Cow and Calf.
