Sprinkle Powder into the food which should be slightly damp.

They will be found to act beneficially upon Horses when out of condition, showing a loss of appetite, humors, staring coat, swollen legs, etc.

Horses: 1 x 20 ml. (10 gm.) measure.

Ponies or small Horses: 1 x 10 ml. (5 gm.) measure

As a general conditioner we recommend 1 x 20 ml. (10 gm.) measure to be given twice weekly.

Where it is desirable to improve the condition and stimulate the appetite, a 20 ml. (10 gm.) measure should be given alternate nights for a week, then repeated after a weeks interval.

Where a horse is generally out of sorts a 20 ml. (10 gm.) measure should be given in the evening feed every night until the animal is restored to its normal state.
