DIRECTIONS

When giving a Ball hold in hand before fire until soft.

If difficult to administer to Horses or Cattle beat into a coarse powder on a cold stone, mix with cold gruel (1 pint) and give as a drench. When giving as a drench do not apply heat or the particles will stick together.

The Balls will not Dissolve.

In cases of scouring the animal should be kept from water as much as possible and have gruel instead.

During the 24 hours after giving a Ball loss of appetite is quite normal and is a desirable effect, the Horse can have all the water he will drink, preferably chilled in cold weather, and be walked for an hour. If the purgative effect is not considered sufficient give him a brisk canter till this is produced.

These Balls will keep any length of time in a cool dry place.

DOSES

Ordinary Horse : One Ball.

Small Horse : Two Thirds of a Ball.

Small Pony : Half of a Ball.

Large Cart Horse : One Ball and a Half.
