# FOOT-ROT OINTMENT.

*Directions.*—When first used, pare the rotten part carefully down, and then rub a portion of the salve well in two or three times a week. In ordinary cases, two dressings are sufficient to effect a cure. If the sheep are very lame, or the weather is unusually wet, it is advisable to fold and keep them on clean dry straw for two hours after dressing. A little tow or hards, rubbed in the salve, should also be stuffed between the cleaves, as it keeps out the moisture and accelerates the cure. This Ointment is also a sovereign remedy for Horses and other Cattle, in all cases of Foul, Grease, Running Thrush, Core or Sitfast; Jointlye, Crown Scab, Quittors, Mallenders, Sallenders, and all Ulcerated Wounds. The parts should be well washed with salt and warm water, and then anointed with the salve two or three times a week.
