GENERAL DIRECTIONS

Place both the Ewes and the lambs on a dry pasture over night, and first thing in the morning, give each lamb a dose of the preventative. Administer same very carefully, and cease giving it immediately coughing ensues. This medicine may be given to lambs from two to six weeks old, and repeated in a fortnight's time, but in bad cases, it may be given more often and in slightly larger doses according to age and condition. The medicine not only arrests the formation of the wool or curd balls, but neutralises all acidity of the stomach, thus preventing Scour or Diarrhoea. Keep the lamb moving about after drenching; also prevent it from lying on the cold pasture.

For Hair Balls in calves, give a dose of the preventative twice a week for a few times. This preparation is ready for immediate use, no Cruel, Bran, etc being needed.

In the event of "scouring" or "Diarrhoea" ensuing, a dose of the "Scour cure" is recommended.
