DIPPING SHEEP

IN THE FARM BUILDINGS. A solution of 1 in 100 (3 tablespoonfuls to a gallon of water) used in piggeries, stables, cowsheds and drains banishes unpleasant odours; it attacks the Common Fly in its resting place and is an economical precaution against Swine Fever, Foot and Mouth Disease, etc. For cleansing Dairies it is strongly recommended; the walls, benches, etc., should be sprayed with a solution of 1 in 300 (1 table-spoonful to a gallon of water). Cowsheds and Stables can be made sweet and clean by periodically spraying with a solution of Tarbol, and all drains and gullies leading therefrom should be regularly flushed. When fattening pigs, both the outside and the sleeping quarters should be regularly disinfected at least once a week, an economical way of providing against swine fever.

FOR CATTLE, HORSES, Etc. For Cattle Washing where Lice are attacking, a solution of 1 in 10 followed by a second wash 10 days later secures cleanliness. TARBOL helps greatly in cases of Grease, Cracked Heel and Warbles, also for Ulcers, Sores and Wounds. In cases of Infectious Diseases it is a necessity. It gives comfort in cases of Mange and Ringworm. Dogs should be washed in a 1 in 50 solution if attacked by Vermin. Fowlhouses should be sprayed frequently with a solution of 1 in 100.

GENERAL. Dilute one gallon of TARBOL with 100 gallons of water.

TIME. No advantage is to be obtained by hurrying the Sheep through the bath: it is essential the dip should penetrate to all parts of the skin: the head should be put under once or twice.

FLY AND MAGGOTS. If the fly be troublesome the stained wool should be trimmed away from the affected part which should then be dressed with a solution of one part of TARBOL to 25 parts of water.

TICKS AND LICE. Use one gallon of TARBOL to 100 gallons of water.

SCAB. For Scab use one gallon of TARBOL to 50 gallons of water, hot or warm. The crust of the scab should be broken and the sheep should remain two or three minutes in the bath. The dipping should be repeated a fortnight after the first dipping.

SHEAR CUTS. Use TARBOL at a strength of one gallon to 25 gallons of water.

FOOT ROT. The feet should be dressed with a knife and TARBOL (without any water) applied with the brush or, if more convenient, the sheep should be allowed to stand in a solution, about one inch deep, consisting of one part of TARBOL to ten parts of water.
