#### ... and a bed

Sleep is a very important part of a kitten's life and young kittens sleep for a large part of the day.

Give your cat or kitten a basket or cardboard box, raised from the floor to exclude draughts. Cardboard boxes make excellent beds for cats since they are easily renewed when dirty and are snug and draught free. Line it with a warm blanket or sheet.



#### .... and a travel basket

When your cat visits the Veterinary Surgeon or stays at a Cattery it is necessary for him to be taken there in a proper travel basket with secure straps.

Many cats are lost through escaping from their owners' arms or falling out of cardboard boxes.

#### Food

At 8 weeks a kitten should be given 4 or 5 meals each day including 1 or 2 meals of baby cereal or rice made with milk. A spot of Marmite can be added to the food once a day. Milk should be given between meals and fresh water should always be available.

An adult cat needs 2 meals each day.

Cats and kittens like a mixed balanced diet consisting of some of the following: red meat egg



cooked fish cheese liver tinned cat food rabbit

Fish and chicken bones must be removed before giving the cat his meal.

Cats like to eat a little grass. If none is available, grow a pot of Cocksfoot grass for him.

(Seed available from The Cats Protection League.)



Brushing and combing will remove loose hair and dirt and help to prevent fur-balls forming in the cats stomach.

If you regularly groom your cat you will keep him clean and healthy and will notice if there is anything wrong with him.

Have your cat's teeth checked regularly by your Veterinary Surgeon.



#### **Fleas and Worms**

All cats have fleas from time to time. Use NUVAN TOP or WELLCARE spray to remove fleas from your cat, and to remove the fleas' eggs from the cat's bedding or from wherever the cat usually sits.

This is one reason for giving your cat a cardboard box bed, since it can be thrown away easily and a new one provided when de fleaing.

Most cats also suffer from worms occasionally and can be treated with worm pills.
