It is the safest and most affective remedy in cases of DISTEMPER and should be given directly the symptoms first appear and continued until complete recovery is affected.

It should be given—in preference to external applications of other remedies, in all cases of SKIN ERUPTIONS, and MANGE, whether external remedies are used or not, and continued for a short time when the disease will soon disappear.

Give an occasional dose, to the mother when taking away the puppies.

DOSES.

Small Spaniels, Terriers, etc.,	2 months old	Half Teaspoonful.
Ditto	3 to full grown	One Teaspoonful.
Large Spaniels, Pointers, Hounds,				
Greyhounds, etc.,	2 months old	One Teaspoonful.
Ditto	3 to 4 months old	Two Teaspoonfuls

Ditto, above four months to full grown, a tablespoonful to be given every morning, according to circumstances; increase the dose if the desired effect is not obtained, but not to purge too much; as the appetite increases it is necessary to feed the Dogs well, and not think they require to be kept low—this likewise applies to Greyhounds, when training and taking the mixture.
