TO INTENDING PURCHASERS OF DOGS

The Committee feel obliged to remind intending purchasers of dogs that they cannot guarantee that any dog purchased from the Home will not develop distemper, owing to the fact that a dog incubating distemper may not show any signs of the disease for some days, and in the meantime appear quite healthy.

The dogs sold at the Home are strays collected from the streets of London and the surrounding districts. Nothing is known of their previous history, where they have been or how long they may have been wandering. Every care is taken to isolate dogs which appear to be sickening for distemper, or to be suffering from any other form of disease, and as a further precaution an intending purchaser may, if he so desires, have the temperature taken of any dog selected by him before the purchase is completed.
