LEIGH BROWNE TRUST.

This Endowment has been founded with the object of promoting and encouraging original research in Physiology and Biology without experimentation on living animals of a nature to cause pain.

The object of the founder of the Leigh Browne Endowment has been to show in practical fashion, to the world in general, and to medical practitioners in particular, that scientific research can be prosecuted, and human suffering alleviated without recourse to any practices that violate the first principles of morality or the canons of scientific observation.

The funds at the disposal of the Trustees may be employed in scientific observation of sound methods for the treatment of disease not founded upon destructive experiments. Also, in subsidizing scientific researchers, in the delivery of lectures, the giving of prizes, the publication of books, pamphlets, &c.

Amongst the works already accomplished by the Endowment may be mentioned:—The sending of a Commission to Paris in 1890 to ascertain the working of Pasteur's method of inoculation; the publication and circulation of Dr. Dolan's report on the same; and the publication and circulation of Dr. Carne Ross's valuable pamphlet on the use of Cinnamon in the treatment of Cancer and other diseases. Other important papers are in process of preparation, which, when matured, the Leigh Browne Trust will circulate.

The smallness of the Endowment, which at present yields an annual income of a little over £100, necessarily limits the operations of the Trustees, and obviously is quite inadequate to the carrying on of this work. It is hoped that friends of righteous methods of biological research will help to increase the Fund, either by gifts or annual subscriptions, or by making bequest.

The funds are held under the usual conditions of trust by six trustees, whose names are given below.
