

#### Save them for Munitions

BONES which can no longer be used even for soup
—Fat which can no longer be used even for cooking—don't throw them away. Don't burn them or put them in the dustbin with other rubbish. Your country needs them. #### You can sell to the Rag-and-Bone Collector

But there comes a time when **fat** can no longer be used, even for frying; when **bones** are no longer of value, even for soup. You *must* throw them away then.

But do not burn them or throw them into the dust-bin, where they would be mixed with ashes and rubbish. Start a special Bone-Bucket, and put in it all bones and all fat with which you have finished. Even the scrapings of plates and pots and pans are valuable. They, too, can be made into glycerine, for firing British Bombs and British Shells.

18 lbs. of Bones, or  $2\frac{1}{2}$  lbs. of Fat will supply enough propellent explosive for an Eighteen Pounder Shell.
