3. The holder must register this book at once by getting his retailers for butcher's meat, bacon, butter and margarine, sugar and tea respectively, to write their names and the addresses of their shops in the proper space on the back of the cover. Persons staying in hotels, boarding houses, hostels, schools, and similar establishments should not register their books until they leave the establishment.

Pension is dependent upon earning capacity, but once it is made permanent it cannot be reduced even though a man earns more.

MEDICAL TREATMENT for his disablement is given to a pensioner free, and during treatment, so long as he is unable to work, he receives an allowance at the highest Disablement rate (that is, 27s. 6d. a week if a private); if he has to go into hospital, allowances are given to his wife and children or dependants.

TRAINING is one of the most important benefits given by the country to pensioners. If a man cannot go back to his former work he may get free training for a new occupation, and during training he is given the same allowances as if he were under medical treatment. Work is easy to get now, but on the return of the able-bodied men at the end of the War it may be hard for the disabled man who is not a skilled work-

All coupons not so used during the period of absence must be detached and destroyed.

11. **DEATH.**—If the holder of this book dies, the book must be immediately given up to the Registrar of Deaths by the person registering the death.

12. Any book not given up to the proper authorities in any of the above cases must be sent at once to the nearest Food Office.

13. It is a summary offence punishable by fine up to £100 or six months' imprisonment, or both, for any person—
