Dear Mr. Bishop,

Miss Lumley Jones tells me that she mentioned to you our technique of mounting specimens on paper. I am enclosing a reprint of the technique and an example of it. The sections tend to curl if exposed in a dry atmosphere but will keep flat in a large envelope. In addition to the convenience for storage in book form, the specimens are very useful for exhibition purposes, when they are best protected by mounting between two thin sheets of Perspex and viewed with transmitted light.

Since perhaps the method is not known in the Wellcome Museum, I am also writing to the Director, and sending him some further examples. This method is applicable to other organs in addition to lung. I shall be very glad to give you any further information I can.
