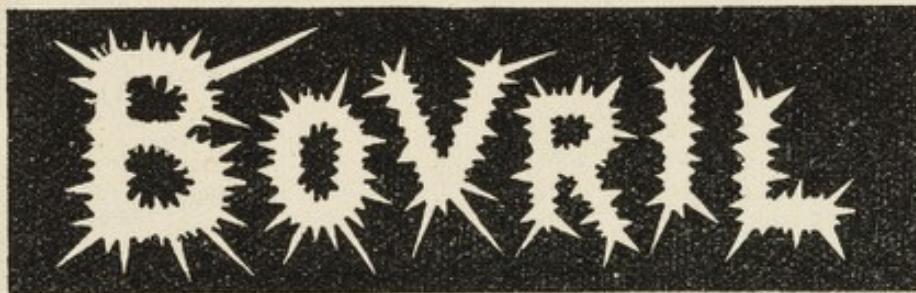
- Bounty**, liberality, generosity; a free gift; a gratuity to persons who enlist; a premium to encourage trade.
- Bouquet**, a bunch of flowers; aroma, as of wine, etc.
- Bourgeois**, a citizen, a burgher.
- Bourn**, a boundary, a limit.
- Bourse**, a place where merchants assemble for business.
- Bout**, a turn, a loop, a contest; as much of an action as is completed at one time.
- Bouts-rimes**, words that rhyme; a game in which the ends of lines of verse are given to persons, who supply suitable words for the remainder.
- Bovine**, pertaining to oxen.
- BOVRIL**, health, strength, energy; power of sustaining fatigue; rapid recuperation after illness; concentrated force; useful in the sick room and the kitchen.
