**DIRECTIONS FOR  
PRESERVING EGGS.**

Take one gallon of recently boiled and cooled water and to it add the contents of this tin and set it aside **TILL QUITE COLD.**

Carefully place the eggs in a suitable wooden or earthenware vessel and pour over them the above cold solution until the topmost layer is well covered. Place the vessel in a reasonably cool place and cover with a cloth to keep out the dust and dirt; the Eggs should be quite clean or the results obtained may prove disappointing.

Fresh Eggs treated with a carefully prepared solution of Water Glass will retain their milky freshness for over six months, but they should be carefully cleaned before treatment.

Before Boiling, prick the larger end of the egg with a pin.
