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#### NEW REPORT ON DIETARY FATS

This Council has for some time been concerned about advice to the British public that dietary levels of fat, and particularly saturated fat, should be restricted as a means of preventing the incidence of Coronary Heart Disease.

Apart from the medical and research evidence for this advice, which we consider to be inadequate, we are also concerned that those who promote the benefits of such diets do not understand their practical implications for individual patterns of food intake and for agriculture. The Council therefore asked Nutritionist, Janet Thorn, to make the necessary assessment, and her results appear in the enclosed report.

The dietary advice is often crystallised (e.g. McGovern Report; Centre for Agricultural Strategy) as the target of 30% of energy from fat with a P/S ratio of 1.0. Janet Thorn shows in her report what this would mean in practice. Changes to the national dietary pattern would be extreme, and have serious implications for livestock production. The implications of intermediate targets are also calculated.
