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

# POST CARD

THE suitability of Massage as a Profession for blind persons has of late found ample proof in the success that has attended students trained at the Massage Branch of the National Institute for the Blind, Great Portland Street, London, W. In the past four years 88 students, 62 being blinded soldiers from St. Dunstan's, have passed the examination of the Incorporated Society. The majority of these students, after qualifying, have been appointed to Military and other hospitals, and many have started in private practice. Arrangements have also been made for the blind masseurs' services to be utilised for the treatment of disabled soldiers in connection with the Local Committees of the Ministry of Pensions. A medico-scientific bibrary has been inaugurated for the use of Massage students, a blind doctor being in charge of this section of the work.
