GENERAL INFORMATION

Two international congresses have already been held, one in Amsterdam in 1952 and one in Rome in 1956. The 1961 Congress will be at Church House, Westminster, London, S.W.1, Monday, July 10 to Friday, July 14 inclusive. The final announcement of the Congress with forms for registration and accommodation will be circulated in the Autumn of 1960 to those who complete and return the enclosed card. The final announcement will contain information on the registration fee, professional visits and social functions.

The Congress languages will be English, French and German, with publication of proceedings in English or French. There will be simultaneous interpretation at the main sessions.

SCIENTIFIC PROGRAMME

The theme of the Congress is Tradition, Science and Practice in Dietetics.

The opening symposium on the history of human diet will be introduced by Dr. N. C. Wright, Deputy Director-General of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations and by Mr. F. Le Gros Clark (U.K.). Under the Chairmanship of Professor E. Neige Todhunter (U.S.A.) this discussion will continue with contributions from five parts of the world.

A symposium on the education and occupations of dietitians will be under the Chairmanship of Miss J. A. S. Ritchie (F.A.O.), with speakers from seven countries.

A limited number of short original communications will be accepted on the following four subjects:

- A. New therapeutic diets
- B. The history of dietetics
- C. Nutrition education
- D. Atherosclerosis

Abstracts of original communications in English or French not exceeding 400 words in length must be received by October 14th, 1960.

On two afternoons there will be a choice of discussion groups or professional visits. The full announcement of the Congress will contain further information on the visits and will include the necessary application forms.

The final session on the links between research in nutrition and its application will be introduced by Mademoiselle Y. Serville (France).
