WESTERN AUSTRALIAN COAST

First sighted by the Dutch explorer Dirck Hartog in the year 1616, 154 years before Captain Cook discovered the Eastern seaboard. Low and sparsely timbered it did not offer much encouragement to the potential settler and the Dutch reported unfavourably for colonising. The palms in the foreground are similar to a species which flourished in the Jurassic period, 150 million years ago. They are locally known as "blackboys" because in their search for game the aboriginals placed the grassy tufts on their heads and stood motionless waiting for unwary kangaroos who mistaking them for palm trees, blundered into the trap.

Since the country became more settled this coastal strip has proved to be one of the State's greatest pastoral areas.
