#### FLOWERS OF AUSTRALIA

THE ILLAWARRA FLAME TREE (Brachychiton acerifolium) at the top of the plate, one of Australia's loveliest trees, is confined to the eastern coast. It is a popular roadside tree and some fine specimens may be seen in Rushcutter's Park, Sydney.

LACE BARK (Brachychiton discolor) is at the bottom of the plate. The flowers of this tree cover the ground beneath it with a pink carpet as they fall. It grows in the inland regions.

The dark red flowers of The Hybrid of Brachychiton acerifolium and the "Kurrajong" (Brachychiton populneum) can be seen in the

Botanical Gardens in Sydney.

The long yellow flowers of the Mistletoe (Dendrophthoe falcata) can be found in the bush of the coastal regions. It is a parasite and grows on the branches of trees wherever the seed is dropped by the birds that eat its fruit.
