FLOWERS OF AUSTRALIA

ILLYARRIE (*Eucalyptus erythrocorys*).

This slender tree of about ten to thirty feet in height is found on the coastal country between the Murchison River and Dandarragan. Its yellow flowers are becoming increasingly popular in the gardens of Australia.

WARATAH (*Telopea speciosissima*).

The Waratah is the flower used to symbolise New South Wales. The "flower" is a collection of small, individual, dark-red blossoms enhanced by the beautiful red floral bracts at the base of the head. It is found on the coast and Dividing Range of New South Wales.

THE WATTLES or ACACIAS (*Acacia decurrens*) with their 400-odd species in Australia are also found in many other parts of the world. They carry their blossoms in crowded balls, in which the stamens are the most conspicuous parts. The Cedar wattle of the Blue Mountains reaches sixty feet but some of the wattle family barely attain eighteen inches in height.
