Read Carefully before completing the form.

Note 1. PERSONS ELIGIBLE.—Subject to the provisions of Part I of the Schedule to The Milk (National Scheme) Order 1941, which governs the Scheme, the following persons are eligible for a supply of one pint of LIQUID MILK per day:—

- (a) an expectant mother, provided the certificate in Section 6 of the Application Form is duly completed;
- (b) a nursing mother while suckling a child, in which case milk or National Dried Milk may not also be supplied or obtained for this child;
- (c) a child less than five years old not being suckled.

Children not more than twelve months old, for whom the certificate in Section 7 of the Application Form is completed, are eligible for the alternative supply of 20 ounces of NATIONAL DRIED MILK per week. National Dried Milk may be obtained from a Milk Office or, in some Areas, a Welfare Centre. Additional quantities may be obtained at 1s. 2d. for 20 ounces as authorised by a Medical Practitioner or a Medical Officer of Health, in accordance with regulations laid down in paragraph 1 of Part I of the Schedule to The Milk (National Scheme) Order, 1941.

Special arrangements, of which particulars may be obtained from any Milk Officer, are in force in respect of inmates of Municipal or Voluntary Institutions, Hospitals, Children's Homes, etc., and this form should not be used in respect of any such persons.

Evacuated children, not in institutions, for whom the billeting allowance at the unaccompanied rate is being paid are eligible for milk at 2d. per pint, or National Dried Milk at 1s. 2d. for 20 ozs., but not for free milk or National Dried Milk.

Children not resident with their parents, but in the care of another person, are eligible for milk at 2d. per pint.

Note 2. INCOME QUALIFICATIONS.—The price to be paid for milk supplied will normally be 2d. per pint.

Milk or National Dried Milk in the cases defined in Note 1 will be supplied free of cost when the total income (exclusive of the earnings of children or of other members of the family) of both parents or of the surviving parent (or, if the child is an orphan, of the persons or person having care of the child), from all sources does not normally exceed the following sums per week, viz.:—

Two Parents	One Parent
40s.	27s. 6d.

To these sums may be added 6s. in respect of each non-earning dependant (see Note 4).

Milk or National Dried Milk in the cases defined in Note 1 will be supplied free of cost for the consumption of nursing and expectant mothers and children under five years old on whose behalf application has been made by an applicant in receipt of Unemployment Assistance (but not necessarily of Unemployment Insurance Benefit), of Public Assistance or of a Supplementary Old Age Pension (but not necessarily of an Ordinary Old Age Pension).

Note 3. APPLICANTS.—The Application Form should normally be completed by the father, stepfather, or father of an adopted child. If the father is unavailable, the mother may apply (including step-mother, or mother of an adopted child).

If the child is an orphan, or not resident with its parents, the person having the care of the child should apply.

If the child has been evacuated under the Government Evacuation Scheme and is billeted with an accompanying parent or other adult, that parent or adult should apply. The householder on whom an

unaccompanied evacuated child is billeted should apply in respect of that child (but see Note 1 above).

Note 4. NON-EARNING DEPENDANTS.—A non-earning dependant is any member of a household, including any child, who is wholly supported by the householder and who has no income or pension from any source. As exceptions to this general rule:—

- (1) A child under 14 years old who is earning not more than 6s. per week may be included as a non-earning dependant.
- (2) Nursing and expectant mothers, and the mother of the child or children in respect of whom application is made, may NOT be included as non-earning dependants.

Children in an institution, hospital, children's home, etc., may not be included as non-earning dependants in Section 9 of the application unless they are only temporary inmates of such institutions and are normally non-earning dependants in the household of the applicant.

Children evacuated to a reception area may be included as non-earning dependants by parents who remain in an evacuation area and who apply for milk for a mother or a child still living in the evacuation area. They may not, however, be included as non-earning dependants by the householder on whom they are billeted in a reception area.

Note 5. RESPONSIBLE PERSON.—Any person in the following classes, or any other person of standing approved by the Milk Officer, may sign the certificate in Section 4 of the Application Form:

- (a) Justice of the Peace. (b) Minister of Religion. (c) Resident Officiating Church Army Officer. (d) Captain of the Salvation Army. (e) Medical Practitioner. (f) Medical Officer of Health. (g) The Principal Officer of a Welfare Centre. (h) Health Visitor. (i) District Nurse or Certified Midwife. (j) Teacher of an Elementary or Secondary School. (k) The Clerk or any Member of a Local Authority. (l) Police Officer not below the rank of Sergeant. (m) Public Assistance Officer. (n) Branch Secretary of the Applicant's Trade Union, Registered Friendly or Approved Society. (o) Principal Officer of a branch of the Soldiers', Sailors' and Airmen's Families Association. (p) Warden of a Residential Settlement. (q) Principal Officer of a Divisional or Local Food Office.

Note 6. BIRTH CERTIFICATES.—Applicants unwilling or unable to obtain the attestation of a "responsible person" for Section 4 of the Form may submit a certified copy of the Birth Certificate(s) of the child (or children) named in Section 3.

Note 7. EXPECTANT MOTHERS.—The certificate in Section 4 need not be completed in respect of an expectant mother alone for whom the certificate in Section 6 is completed.

Note 8. ADVICE.—The Milk Officer will give advice in completing the Application Form if required.

Note 9. FORWARDING APPLICATION FORM. When completed this Application Form should be folded and posted to the Milk Officer at least 14 days before a permit is required. It is not necessary to affix a postage stamp.

Note 10. PERMITS.—If the application is approved the Milk Officer will issue a permit:

- (a) for liquid milk for presentation to the milk distributor of the applicant's choice.
- (b) for dried milk for presentation weekly at the place stated on the permit.
