In 1987, the first Quilt panel was sewn here in San Francisco to remember a special friend who had died from AIDS.

Today, the Quilt has 30,000 panels from all over the world. And today, AIDS has killed three million people worldwide. It's now the leading cause of death among Americans, ages 25 to 44.

This June, as part of the United Nations' 50th Anniversary, the International AIDS Memorial Quilt will be displayed at the Yerba Buena Gardens. It will have panels from 30 countries and will cover a city block.

The exhibit will be from 12 to 6 pm Friday, 10 am to 6 pm Saturday and Sunday. Admission is free.

Witness the Quilt. Remember, a world without AIDS can exist again.
