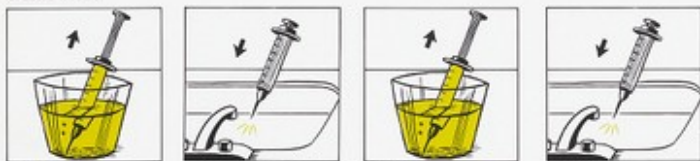
BLEACHMANSM

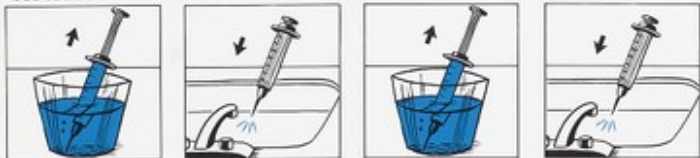
