DARE TO CARE!!

Basic condom sense

★ Latex condoms protect from AIDS, sexually transmitted diseases and pregnancy ★

■ BE RESPONSIBLE: USE THEM! ■



- Keep a supply of Latex condoms, in a safe, cool, dry place.
- Check expiry date before use.
- Open packet carefully.



- Put condom on hard penis before the penis comes in contact with your partner.
- Gently press the air out of the tip, and hold it against the tip (glans) of the penis.



- ★ IMPORTANT: All fluid coming out of the penis contains sperm and possibly germs.
- Unroll the condom carefully to the base of the erect penis.



- Use Nonoxynol-9 lubricated condoms and water soluble lubricants found in drugstores. Do not use oil based products.
- ★ Nonoxynol-9 products should not be used for anal sex.



- Make sure condom does not slip off during intercourse.
- After ejaculating, withdraw penis immediately holding on to the base of the condom, to prevent spillage.



- Wrap condom in a tissue paper and throw away in a garbage.
- Do not flush! (Plugs plumbing!)
- Never reuse a condom!

Use a condom everytime!
