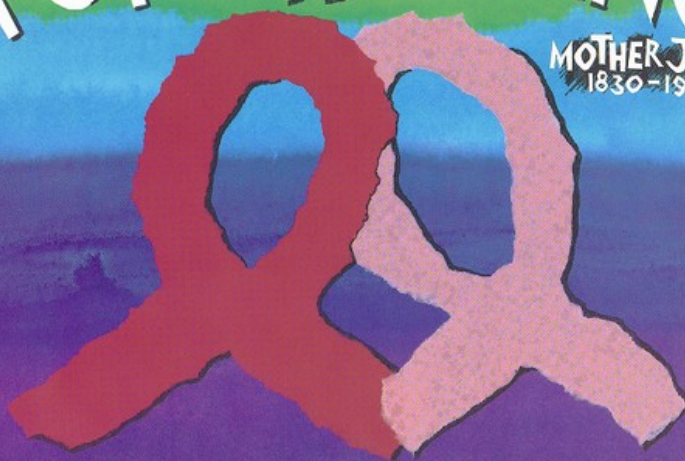

MOTHER JONES
1830-1930



Historically, the United States Government has maintained a greater commitment to absurd and excessive military spending than to the well-being of the people. This injustice is highlighted by some frightening statistics:

According to the War Resisters League, the U.S. will spend \$302 billion on the military in 1995 – including a commitment to build eight new B-2 bombers which cost \$2.4 billion each. The B-2 bomber was developed as an offensive weapon to seek and destroy Soviet targets.



According to the U.S. Public Health Service, in 1995 the U.S. will spend \$3 billion on research, prevention and treatment for AIDS and breast cancer combined. In 1994 there were 183,000 new cases of breast cancer and 46,300 deaths, 80,691 new cases of AIDS and 50,171 deaths.

— Mother Jones (1830-1930) was a fiery, diligent United Mine Worker and labor organizer who used all of her 100 years on earth to fight injustice. —
