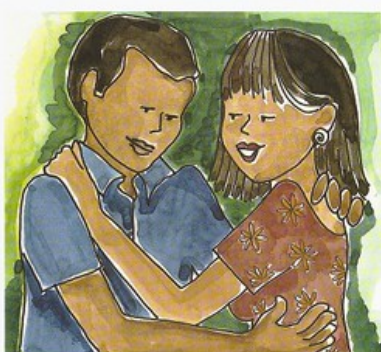

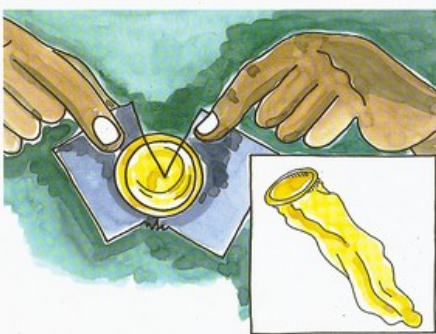

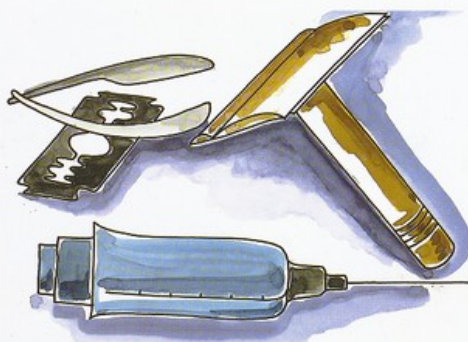
Being mutually faithful to your sexual partner.
