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# You Cannot Get AIDS from ...

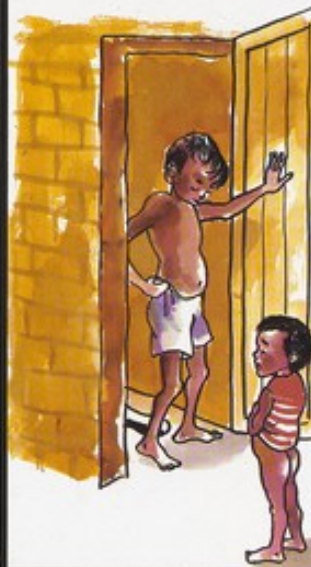
YOU CANNOT GET AIDS from ... sharing clothing, combs



... towels or basins



... toilets or latrines



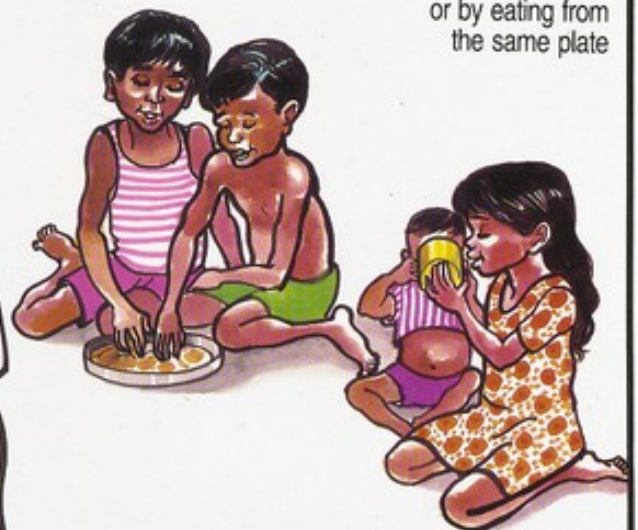
YOU CANNOT GET AIDS from mosquitoes, bedbugs, flees, lice and other insects, not from rats or any other animal



YOU CANNOT GET AIDS from normal contact such as shaking hands, holding, crying, sneezing or kissing



YOU CANNOT GET AIDS from sharing drinking cups, eating utensils, or by eating from the same plate



**PREVENT AIDS.** Learn the ways it can and cannot spread.

**AIDS IS NOT SPREAD in the ways shown above.**

AIDS is spread through sexual intercourse with an infected person, through blood contaminated instruments, infected blood transfusions and through infected women to their unborn children during pregnancy or at birth.
