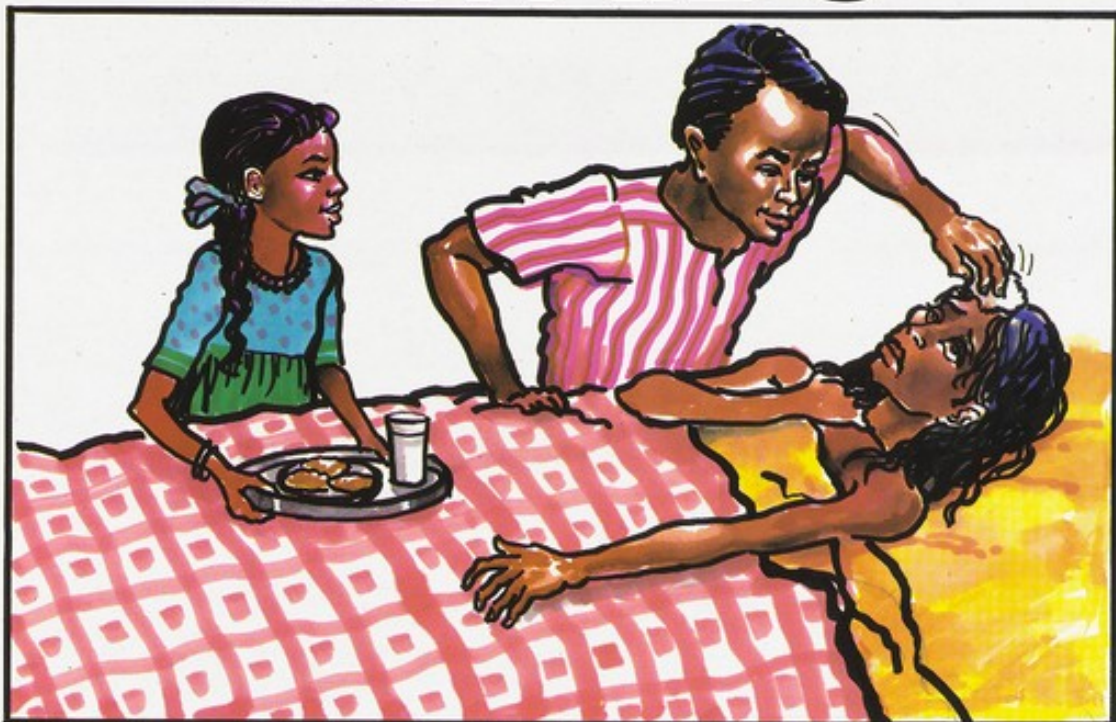

Wash hands

Wash hands often especially after using latrines or toilets, changing soiled bedding and clothing and before handling your own or the patient's food.



Cover wounds

Cover wounds on hands or places likely to touch the patient. Use clean cloth or plasters to cover wounds.



Keep clean

Keep all bedclothes, towels, the patient's body and clothing clean. Particularly clean away faeces, blood, vomit and sweat. Use bleach on bedclothes or dry them in the sun and iron them



Do not share sharp things

Do not share razors, toothbrushing sticks, other things which can possibly draw blood or touch sores.
