Follow these steps:

- Encourage Bleeding, where appropriate. Wash thoroughly under running water. Note sources of exposure.
- 2 Report to supervisor on duty.
- Report to Infection Control Nurse Complete Accidental Exposure Forms.
- Employee will receive counselling about HBV/HIV exposures from the Infection Control Nurse.
- 5 HBV/HIV testing will be voluntary.
- Test results will remain confidential, known only to the Infection Control Nurse and will be released only with your written consent.
