## Abstract of Quarantine Regulations.

It is in the first place to be observed, THAT ALL PERSONS are presumed to know, and are bound to take Notice, not only of the Quarantine Regulations established by Act of Parliament, (as they are of any other Public Act), but likewise of every Order in Quantitine and published in the London Gazette: and as it is easily in their Power to inform themselves of such Regulations, and particular Care is taken by this and other Menus to promulgate such of them as apply to their respective Situations, perceivagly to their being actually yet under Quarantine Officers, no Plea of Ignorance will be admitted as an Excuse for any Neglect, Brooth, or Violation thereof; but for the sake of Example, and for the Security of the Public Health, the Palist, Penalties, and Publichents of the Law will be enforced with the utmost Severity.
