When from any cause baby must be bottle-fed Horlick's may be used with confidence. It is especially valuable in complementary or supplementary feeding, and for premature, delicate and under-nourished babies generally.

A Feeding Schedule for an average child is given on page 2. It may be necessary to alter the amounts per feed and number and frequency of feeds, according to the requirements of each individual child upon the advice of the Physician or a qualified Nurse. When using Horlick's (or any new food)

for the first time, give it to the baby for several feeds slightly more diluted than the directions specify, and gradually increase the strength of the solution till it complies with the Schedule.

Weaning

Horlick's is also an excellent food for baby during the weaning period. Weaning should be a gradual process. At first one bottle per day should be substituted for one breast feed. This should be continued for a week before a second bottle is substituted for a second breast feed, and so on. The total number of feeds per day during the weaning period should not be more than five.

Once or twice a week the yolk of a lightly boiled egg may be added with advantage, and veal broth, potato or other vegetable puree should occasionally be substituted. During this period baby must learn to chew, and starchy or farinaceous foods must be introduced into the diet. Horlick's Rusks are excellent for this purpose—babies love them, and they are shaped so that chubby little hands can hold them easily. They are crisp and very nourishing; they promote the flow of saliva, assist the cutting of the teeth and yet are not so hard as to injure the tender gums.

Diseases of Children.

The constitution of Horlick's Malted Milk makes it an ideal food in the case of older children who are suffering from any of the diseases peculiar to children. It has proved of special value in the treatment of summer diarrhoea and dysentery, marasmus, acidosis, cœliac disease and in any case where fat is not well tolerated, and for debilitated and under-weight children.
