- Over 80,000 people in the UK are now living with HIV.

- Over a quarter of people in the UK living with HIV don't know they are infected.

- The main ways HIV is transmitted are through unprotected vaginal or anal sex, or through sharing injecting equipment.

- The best ways to protect yourself are to always use a condom during sex, and never share needles.

- There is no cure for HIV, but there are effective treatments available.
