
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Malaria Free Kenya-it is possible!

- When you or your child has fever, visit the nearest health facility; If the health worker finds you have malaria he or she will give you AL, the recommended treatment for malaria.
- Ensure each member of your family sleeps under Long Lasting Insecticide treated Nets, to prevent malaria.
- All pregnant women living in areas where malaria is a problem should receive SP at every clinic visit.
- Intensify the fight against malaria – allow officers to spray the inside walls of your house.
