Dear Sir,

I desire to thank you for your letter of the 9th February, enclosing the report on the 600 old books on medicine, and also for the M.S. of Medical Secrets by D.N. Pace, which has safely come to hand. I will keep the M.S., and enclose you herewith cheque for the value of the same, namely, sixteen lira.

With respect to the old medical books in your list, I have not yet had time to go through them, but as a great deal of their value depends upon their condition, the best way would be for you to send me the whole lot on approval, and I could then select those I wanted, or make you an offer for the whole of them. They could be sent very cheaply by sea from Genoa to London direct, or by rail-Petite Vitesse, whichever you think best, and I will pay carriage. If you are agreeable to do this I shall be glad if you will send them off at once, as I expect to be doing abroad in about a month's time.

I am always open to purchase ancient M.S.s, and early printed books, especially important ones on medicine, surgery, alchemy, astrology and botany, and I should be glad if you will report to me a full description of any you may meet with, with prices, and give me the first offer of the same before including them in the catalogue or offering them elsewhere. I can give you bankers' references in London if required.

Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 25th February, I note what you say respecting the library of medical books. Of course, as you are well aware, it is never very satisfactory to make a purchase of this kind without first seeing the books, but I quite recognise the difficulty of your position in the matter.

I have now gone carefully through the catalogue which you have kindly sent me, and I note that the majority of the books were printed during the eighteenth century, in fact, only fifty-six out of the entire number were printed before 1700. As you are aware, no doubt, books of this period unless of some special rarity, are of very little value, and realise practically nothing when sold by auction. The best plan will be for me to make you an offer for the lot. As the carriage that I shall have to pay from Turin to London will be a considerable item, and taking other matters into consideration, I think that one thousand lira Italian would be a liberal price for the six hundred and twenty books.

With reference to the copy of Mesue which you kindly sent me for inspection, I have already a copy of this edition, and in London it is not worth more than twelve lira at the outside. I will, therefore, return it to you on hearing from you again.

Dear Sir.

I am almost sorry to inform you that the collection of Books on Old Medicine you wanted to go through cannot be sent on approval.

Look here, I want to be quite frank with you: When travelling abroad I discovered these 620 works on Old Medicine. As I could not dispose at once of the sum the proprietors asked from me I arranged with them to sell the Collection on commission.
