The are figured in an article on "The Invention and Evalution of Midwifery Forceps", by Sir A.R. Simpson which was published in the 'Scottish Medical and Surgical Journal' for December 1900. On page 481 is an illustration with an inscription "Dr. Walker's Forceps, from a pair in the Blinburgh Obstetrical Museum.
