## GENERAL OBSERVATIONS.

The principal objects for which a Soldier is required to be in possession of this Book, are, to secure to him, whilst in the Army, a proper settlement of his Pay, Allowances, and Clothing, and that he may have a Record, establishing his claim to any benefits to which he may be entitled under Her Majesty's Regulations for granting Pensions, Allowances, and Gratuities, to discharged Soldiers, who have performed good and faithful Service, and to assist in the disposal of his effects, in the event of his dying intestate.

It is therefore the Soldier's interest to take care that his Book is at all times correctly and completely kept.

When a Soldier is discharged, he is to take his Book away with him: in the event of a Soldier dying in the Service, his Book will be forwarded to his relations or representatives if they desire it; and if it contain a record of Wounds received in action, or of distinguished acts of Bravery, it will remain an honourable memorial of his character and conduct.

## PART I.—PAY.

### Service.

459. A Soldier's service shall commence on the day of attestation, and all full pay service after the age of 18 shall count towards the completion of the period for which he enlisted, and shall entitle him to the different rates of good-conduct pay and to pension on discharge. The age specified in the attestation shall be taken to be the real age, but the Soldier shall in no case benefit by any misrepresentation which may be subsequently discovered.

460. The service of Militiamen, who fraudulently enlisted into the Army prior to 20th April, 1858, and were sent on foreign service, shall count from the date of attestation towards the term of service for which Soldiers enlist, and for good-conduct pay and pension. The service of Militiamen, who fraudulently enlisted on and subsequently to 20th April, 1858, shall reckon from the date of attestation towards the term of service for which Soldiers enlist, and from the date of completion of their Militia engagement towards good-conduct pay and pension.

461. The service of Men permitted to volunteer from the Militia shall count from the date of attestation towards good-conduct pay, pension, and towards the term of service for which Soldiers enlist, re-enlist, or re-engage.

462. The two years' service granted to the Non-commissioned Officers and Men who volunteered from the Forces of the late East India Company, shall reckon in diminution of the term for which the Soldier enlists or re-engages, and towards pension. The one year's service granted to the garrisons which defended Lucknow and the Alumbagh prior to the advance of the Forces under the late Lord Clyde, shall reckon towards good-conduct pay and pension, but not in diminution of the period for which the Soldier enlists or re-engages.

463. Soldiers confined in lunatic asylums may reckon the period of such confinement towards the completion of their term of service and towards pension, but not towards good-conduct pay.

464. Three years' service by Europeans on the West Coast of Africa shall count as five towards pension.

465. Service in the embodied Militia in the case of a Sergeant transferred to the Permanent Staff thereof shall reckon in diminution of the term for which the Soldier enlists and towards good-conduct pay and pension.

### Forfeiture of Service and of the Advantages derived therefrom.

466. A Soldier absent from duty by reason of imprisonment under sentence of a Civil Court or of a Court-martial, confinement for debt, or absence without leave, except as laid down in Article 467, or desertion, or, if an apprentice when enlisted, by reason of his being allowed to serve out his time with his master, shall not reckon the period of such absence (including the day of release) as a part of the term for which he was enlisted or re-engaged, or towards good-conduct pay or to pension on discharge.

467. A Soldier imprisoned by order of his Commanding Officer, or who since the 25th of April, 1865, may have been or shall hereafter be in confinement while awaiting trial by Court-martial or other court, shall not reckon the period of such absence towards good-conduct pay or pension, but such imprisonment shall not affect the period of his service.

468. A Soldier convicted by sentence of a Court-martial shall forfeit the advantages of former service if such forfeiture form part of the sentence, but not otherwise, except as provided in Article 470.

469. A Soldier absent from his duty from whatever cause, except on Pass or Furlough, shall forfeit the advantages of service for the periods of such absence; but if a Soldier shall be absent without leave for a period not exceeding five days, such forfeiture may, at the discretion of his Commanding Officer, be remitted; or if a Soldier shall be absent from duty awaiting trial for a longer period than the eight days laid down in the Articles of War, our Secretary of State for War may restore the service of the period exceeding the eight days towards good-conduct pay and pension.

470. A Soldier found guilty by Court-martial of desertion, or of wilfully tampering with his eyes, or maiming or injuring himself or any other Soldier, with intent to render himself or any other Soldier unfit for service, or sentenced to penal servitude, or convicted of felony, in any civil court in the United Kingdom or in any of our colonies or dependencies beyond the seas, forfeits all the advantages derived from his prior service.

471. If the Soldier thus convicted shall, subsequently to such conviction, perform good, faithful, or gallant service, he may, on the same being duly certified by our

Commander-in-Chief, be restored to the benefits derived from the whole or of any part of his Service, upon our pleasure to that effect being signified by our Secretary of State; such restoration of service shall also include the restoration of any medals earned previously to conviction.

#### Re-engagement.

451. A Soldier enlisted under the Army Service Act, who while serving shall renew his engagement for a further term, will be entitled, on such re-engagement, to the regulated rate of bounty in force at the time, and the free kit of a private, or an allowance in lieu thereof, which shall be fixed from time to time by our Secretary of State for War; the sum of 1s. shall also, if demanded, be payable to the magistrate's clerk by whom the declaration on re-engagement is filled up; but rewards shall not in such cases be admissible. Such soldiers shall receive, in addition to the new bounty, 20 days' marching money at 1s., a gratuity of 1s., and a Furlough for two months, or a pecuniary allowance in lieu thereof (Arts. 564, and 565.)

452. A soldier who shall re-engage while serving, may, provided no additional expense be incurred, be specially permitted to re-engage in any other regiment, battalion, or corps of the same arm of the service as that of his former regiment, and in such cases shall receive the several advantages granted by the preceding Article.

453. An Army Schoolmaster shall not re-engage without previous reference to our Adjutant-General and the concurrence of our Council of Military Education, and on re-engagement he shall not be entitled to bounty or the gratuities specified in Art. 451, except the gratuity for furlough.

454. A soldier, under the age of 34, and of good character, discharged after the completion of his first term of limited engagement, may, upon production of his certificate of discharge, be permitted to re-engage for any corps of the same arm of the service as that from which he shall have been discharged; and if he re-engages within 12 months from the date of his discharge he will be permitted to reckon his former service, on application being made by his Commanding Officer on his behalf to our Secretary of State for War (Art. 472). Such soldier shall receive the regulated rate of bounty in force at the time of his re-engagement and the free kit of a private, or an allowance in lieu thereof, but no levy money, except as specified in Art. 446, shall be payable in such cases. Soldiers of the Canadian Rifles shall be allowed to reckon their former service irrespective of the interval which may have elapsed since their discharge.

#### Re-enlistment.

455. A soldier, under the age of 34, of good character, who shall quit the army during his first term of service, except for the purpose of being re-enlisted to fill a special situation, may, upon production of his certificate of discharge, be permitted to re-enlist for any arm of the service, and if he re-enlists within 12 months from the date of his discharge, he will be permitted to reckon his former service towards good-conduct pay and pension on application being made as directed in Art. 454. Such engaged, and has re-engaged for either of the further periods indicated in the Army Service Act, 10 & 11 Viet. cap. 57, rect. 3, shall reckon in diminution of the entire period for which he shall have been attested and re-engaged. Such soldier shall receive the regulated rate of bounty in force at the time of his re-enlistment, and the free kit of a private, or allowance in lieu thereof, but no levy money, except as specified in Art. 446, shall be payable in such cases. Soldiers of the Canadian Rifles shall be allowed to reckon their former service irrespective of the interval which may have elapsed since their discharge.

456. Soldiers enlisted for unlimited service who have obtained or may hereafter obtain, their discharge free or by purchase, may be re-enlisted for that arm of the service from which they were discharged up to the age of 35 for our Cavalry, Artillery, and Engineers, and 36 for our Infantry, provided they are in other respects eligible.

457. Soldiers who have been or may hereafter be discharged during their second term of limited service shall not be permitted to re-enter our Army.

#### Former Service of Re-engaged and Re-enlisted Men.

472. Soldiers re-engaging prior to discharge during their first period of service shall reckon the full period of their former service towards good-conduct pay and pension.

473. Soldiers who have been permitted to re-engage or re-enlist subsequently to the 29th October, 1861, within one year of their discharge into any corps of the same arm of the service as that from which they were discharged, shall, with the sanction of our Secretary of State for War, count the full period of their former service towards good-conduct pay and pension, and may, from the date of re-engagement or re-enlistment, resume the good-conduct badges and rates of good-conduct pay of which they shall

have been in possession at the time of discharge, but such pay shall not be issued to them until they shall have joined their regiments or corps.

474. Soldiers discharged prior to 30th October, 1861, and re-enlisted subsequently to that date, shall be allowed, in conformity with the regulations in force at the time of their discharge, the whole of their former service towards good-conduct pay and pension, provided they shall have re-enlisted within two years from the date of their discharge, and shall have been specially recommended for such indulgence after not less than six months' fresh service.

475. A soldier discharged from the Army for incapacity for further service or for any other cause, who shall, on re-enlisting or re-engaging, conceal the fact or misrepresent the cause of his former discharge, shall not reckon his former service.

476. If during the second period of service gallant service shall be performed, former service forfeited by non-compliance with the above conditions may be restored.

477. A soldier re-enlisting or re-engaging, who, on discharge, received a gratuity as a settler, shall, to entitle him to reckon former service, refund such gratuity; but a soldier discharged with a temporary pension shall not be called upon to refund it, and on re-enlistment within the prescribed limits may reckon former service.

478. Discharged soldiers of the late East India Company's service, except those who claimed their discharge under the Act 21 & 22 Viet. cap. 105, on being called upon to transfer their service to the regular Army, will, on re-enlisting, be allowed to reckon their former service in the East India Company's service, but soldiers who claim their discharge under the said Act shall not, on re-enlisting, be allowed to reckon their former service.

479. Former service in our Royal Marines, and, under the special authority of our Secretary of State for War, in the case of men enlisting subsequently to 10th August, 1859 in the Irish Constabulary, shall reckon as military service towards good-conduct pay and pension, but service in our Navy shall not so reckon.

#### DECORATIONS, MEDALS, AND ANNUITIES.

##### War Medals and Clasp.

709. War medals and clasps are granted by us at our pleasure in commemoration of arduous campaigns and well-fought and well-sustained battles and sieges. Our pleasure as to the issue of these special marks of our approval of the service of our troops in the field shall, as heretofore, be notified in each case through our Secretary of State for War; and the following general rules shall regulate the distribution of these decorations.

710. The medal commemorative of a campaign may be given to all enlisted men, whether combatant or non-combatant, serving with an Army in the field.

711. Clasp for battles or special operations against an enemy may be issued to all combatants actually engaged; but these distinctions shall only be conferred upon such non-combatant Non-commissioned Officers and Men of the Departments of our Army, enumerated in Sect. 4, as shall be actually exposed to fire under circumstances which may have rendered such exposure a duty.

##### Medals and Annuities for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Conduct.

702. Sums not exceeding 4,400*l.* for the Cavalry and Infantry, 310*l.* for the Royal Artillery, and 90*l.* for the Royal Engineers, shall be yearly distributed on the recommendation of our Commander-in-Chief in annuities not exceeding 20*l.*, as rewards for distinguished or meritorious service, amongst sergeants either before or after discharge. Such annuities may be held in addition to pension.

703. A silver medal, having on one side the Royal effigy, and on the other the words "For Meritorious Service," and the name and regiment of the sergeant, with the date of grant, shall be issued to every sergeant annuitant; and such annuities and medals shall not be forfeited, except by sentence of Court-martial, or by conviction for felony in a court of criminal jurisdiction.

704. Upon the special recommendation of our Commander-in-Chief, a silver medal, bearing on it the words "For Distinguished Conduct in the Field" shall be issued to Sergeant Annuitants in lieu of the before-mentioned medal for "Meritorious Service."

705. Like medals for distinguished conduct in the field, without annuity or gratuity, shall also be granted to sergeants, corporals, and privates of our Army specially recommended by our Commander-in-Chief, and approved by our Secretary of State for War, for acts of distinguished conduct in the field.

##### Medals and Gratuities for Long Service and Good Conduct.

706. The under-mentioned gratuities shall be granted, at the discretion of Com-





A second entry within 12 months of the first offence shall render two years uninterrupted good conduct necessary to the restoration of such badge and pay.

788. One entry, in the Regimental Defaulters' Book, of the name of a soldier entitled to two badges, shall forfeit one badge and the corresponding good-conduct pay for one year from the date of the offence or release from imprisonment. A second entry within 12 months of the first offence shall prolong the forfeiture of his first badge and corresponding pay for a year from the date of his second offence or release from second imprisonment, and shall also forfeit his second badge and corresponding pay for a year after the restoration of the first. A third entry within 12 months of the second offence shall prolong the forfeiture of his first badge and pay for a year from the date of his third offence, or release from third imprisonment, and that of his second badge and pay for a year after the restoration of the first, and shall also forfeit his third badge and pay for a year after the restoration of the second, and so on as to every badge and the corresponding pay.

789. A soldier who shall have forfeited all his badges and the corresponding pay, and whose name shall be again entered in the Regimental Defaulters' Book, before the restoration of any badge or pay under Arts. 787 and 788, shall serve two years with uninterrupted good conduct to obtain the restoration of each one of the badges and the corresponding pay which he shall have forfeited.

790. As soon as a soldier shall have regained the maximum number of badges, and amount of corresponding pay, to which he may have been entitled at any former period of his service, he shall fall under Arts. 779 and 783, with respect to any further badges and the corresponding pay.

791. Courts-martial may order the forfeiture of all or any of the good-conduct pay and badges of a soldier, either absolutely or for any term of not less than 18 months, for a first serious offence.

792. A sergeant or other non-commissioned officer, above the rank of corporal, reduced to the ranks, but not sentenced by court-martial to forfeit all or any part of his good-conduct pay, or convicted of felony by a court of criminal jurisdiction, may be allowed to reckon his service as non-commissioned officer as good-conduct service, and shall receive the rate of good-conduct pay of such service, in addition to his pay as a private, subject only to a deduction of one penny a day for one year from the date of the offence for which he shall have been reduced, or of his release from imprisonment, as the case may be.

793. The soldier who, under the provisions of Arts. 451-455, shall re-engage or re-enlist within 12 months after his discharge, will resume his badges and the corresponding good-conduct pay of which he was in receipt at the date of his discharge, if, upon re-engagement or re-enlistment he shall correctly declare the particulars of his former service and the date of his discharge; and, provided such former service shall, in the first instance, have been allowed by our Secretary of State for War, upon the recommendation of his commanding officer.

794. Our pardon shall restore a soldier's forfeited service, and with it his badges and good-conduct pay. From the date of pardon he shall receive the rate of good-conduct pay of which he would have been in receipt if the offence for which his former service was forfeited had not been committed, and may receive a further increase of good-conduct pay so soon as he shall become entitled thereto by length of service and good conduct without being required to have been in possession of the previous rate for two years. But he shall not receive any arrears of good-conduct pay accrued due prior to the offence for which his former service was forfeited.

795. A soldier transferred from the Militia to our regular Army shall keep the rewards of which he was in possession under the regulations of that service, and as to further rewards, shall be subject to these regulations from the date of transfer.

796. A soldier transferred from the Militia to our regular Army and allowed to reckon half his embodied militia service, shall serve for the period of two years without an entry in the Regimental Defaulters' Book, to obtain his first badge and corresponding good-conduct pay. A soldier permitted on re-engagement or re-enlistment to reckon his former service, shall be permitted to count periods prior to discharge and subsequent to re-engagement as *continuous service*, so far as possession of lower rates of good-conduct pay and absence of name from defaulter's book are concerned.

797. Soldiers in our Ceylon Rifle Regiment and Malta Fencibles shall receive the badges and half the rate of good-conduct pay specified in the foregoing Articles.

798. Natives, privates, and buglers of the Gun Lascars shall receive the badges, and half a rupee a month for each badge in lieu of the good-conduct pay specified in the foregoing Articles.

799. Former service in all ranks, after the age of 18, shall be reckoned in the periods necessary to entitle soldiers to good-conduct pay and badges.

800. Good-conduct pay shall be issued at the rates and subject to the restrictions

specified in the foregoing Articles, although no claim shall have been made by the soldier entitled thereto.

#### DISCHARGE.

480. No soldier can demand his discharge, as a matter of right, but discharge may be granted—

1. On account of incapacity for further service.
2. In consequence of reduction of the military establishment.
3. As an indulgence.

481. Soldiers who, at the expiration of their term of enlistment, take their discharge under the "Army Service Act," or who are granted a free discharge as an indulgence, or who, on account of their bad character, or bad character and unfitness, are not permitted to re-engage, shall receive the sum of 1s. a day as subsistence money for five days from the date of discharge.

482. A soldier discharged to pension (whether permanent or temporary, but not to deferred pension), with a gratuity on reduction, or from physical unfitness, shall receive the sum of 1s. a day for twenty days; and if entitled to a higher rate of pension than 1s. a day, shall, in addition, be paid the difference between the allowance of 1s. and his rate of pension for twenty days.

483. A soldier discharged, except with ignominy, either with or without pension, shall, if proceeding to his place of enlistment, or intended residence, if not more distant, or in the case of a discharged man re-enlisted, the place at which he was attested for his last period of service, shall be entitled to a free passage at any time within one month from the date of his discharge.

484. A soldier discharged with ignominy shall, if a conveyance cannot be provided for him, receive subsistence money at a rate not exceeding 1d. a mile, to his home.

485. A soldier of our West India Regiments shall, if entitled to pension, continue to draw his regimental pay till his pension papers reach him. If not entitled to pension, he shall be granted free rations till he shall reach the place of his enlistment or intended residence, if not more distant.

#### Purchased Discharges.

486. A soldier of good character may be permitted to purchase his discharge, or obtain free discharge at his own request, upon the terms specified in the next Article, 487, if he shall have served the requisite period; the number of men to be so annually discharged, and their selection, shall be governed by such instructions as our Commander-in-Chief, with the concurrence of our Secretary for War, may give from time to time.

487. The sums payable for purchased discharges by soldiers on home service, or by soldiers in the colonies intending to return home, shall, if they enlisted prior to 23rd July, 1864, be governed by our Royal Warrant of 1st July, 1848, or this our present Warrant, as they shall elect; if they enlisted subsequently to that date, the sums shall be according to the scale of the following table. Except in the case of schoolmasters, who shall pay a sum of 50*l.* for their discharge, unless our Secretary of State for War shall think fit in special cases to diminish this amount. If a soldier, who originally enlisted under our Royal Warrant of 1st July, 1848, shall re-engage or re-enlist subsequently to the 23rd July, 1864, he shall be entitled to a discharge under the conditions laid down in this our Warrant.

489. Service in all ranks above that of Corporal shall reckon as good-conduct service.

490. A soldier re-enlisting for a second period and not entitled to reckon former service, may be permitted to purchase his discharge at the rates specified in the first part of the above scale.

491. The sums payable for discharges by soldiers present with their regiments in the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, British West India Colonies, British Guiana, British Honduras, British North America (including British Columbia), Bermuda, the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, Saint Helena, the West Coast of Africa, Mauritius, Ceylon, or Hong Kong, and intending to settle, subject to such instructions as shall from time to time be given, shall be as follows:—

492. A soldier who may wish to settle in a Colony may, upon discharge, and if certified to be in good health, receive a gratuity at the following rate; but this gratuity shall be paid to him only in the Colony, and in such manner, and at such times, within 18 months after his arrival, as the General Officer in Command of the Station, or the Governor of the Colony shall determine. Permission to settle in the Colonies shall be governed by the instructions of our Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Provided always, that the Non-commissioned Officer shall have served 21 years in the Artillery, Engineers, or Infantry, or 24 years in the Cavalry, and shall have been discharged as a Non-commissioned Officer, having served without interruption as such for one year immediately preceding his discharge. No Non-commissioned Officer shall receive the aforesaid superior rates if discharged whilst holding an inferior rank.

4. To Soldiers discharged after 21 years' service in the Artillery, Engineers, or Infantry, or 24 years' service in the Cavalry, for disabilities contracted in and by the service which not only unfit them for the ordinary duties of soldiers, but which render them incapable of earning a livelihood, a temporary increase of pension to the following extent may be granted:—

5. If discharged on account of permanent disabilities contracted in and by the service after 14, but under 21 years in the Artillery, Engineers, or Infantry, or after 17 but under 24 years in the Cavalry, a pension at the following rates will be allowed, viz.:—

such pension being granted either permanently or conditionally, as may appear to be warranted by the nature of the disability. Provided, however, that in the case of a Serjeant, Corporal, or Bombardier, discharged as such, his service shall have been at least of three years' duration in the rank of a Non-commissioned Officer.

The precise amount of pension shall be regulated by the time the soldier may have served, the climate in which he may have been serving, the degree of the disability as affecting his means of earning a livelihood, and his conduct while serving.

The conditional pensions which may have been awarded to men discharged as unfit for the ordinary duties of a soldier on account of disabilities contracted in and by the Service, after the completion of 14 years' service in the Artillery, Engineers, or Infantry, or of 17 years in the Cavalry, may, under extraordinary circumstances of extreme suffering, or of continued or permanent incapacity to earn a sufficient livelihood, be renewed or made permanent.

6. If discharged previously to the completion of 21 years' service in the Artillery, Engineers, or Infantry, or 24 years' service in the Cavalry, on account of disability contracted in and by the Service, Temporary Pension may be allowed according to the following scale:—

In severe cases of disability or injury, resulting entirely from Military duty, or from the effects of climate, under 21 years' service in the Artillery, Engineers, or Infantry, or under 24 years' service in the Cavalry, the temporary pension may be renewed for such further period as the special circumstances of the case may warrant, or, under extraordinary circumstances of extreme suffering, or of permanent incapacity to earn a sufficient livelihood, the temporary pension may be made permanent; and in special cases of men of this class, whose service shall be above 14 but under 21 years in the Artillery, Engineers, or Infantry, and be above 17 but under 24 years in the Cavalry, the rate of pension may be increased to that warranted for men discharged on account of permanent disabilities.

A Non-commissioned Officer, who shall have served continuously as such at least 3 years in the rank of Non-commissioned Officer, may be allowed an addition to the temporary pension which would have been granted to him if he had been discharged as a Gunner, Driver, Sapper, or Private, not exceeding the following rates:—

In special cases, where it may be considered more advantageous to the European soldier's interests that a gratuity in money, proportioned to the length of his services, and the duration of the temporary pension awarded, should be given instead of the temporary pension, a sum varying from 12 to 20, may be allowed; but in every instance the gratuity shall be paid to the soldier only after his arrival at the place of his intended future residence.

#### Good Conduct Pay with Pension.

European soldiers, below the rank of Serjeant, who under the terms of their enlistment, are not entitled to additional pay for length of service, and Black Soldiers, who, by their good conduct, shall have obtained one or more distinguishing marks, shall be entitled to have the full rate of good-conduct pay of which they shall be in possession at the time of their discharge added to the rate of their pension, whether temporary, or conditional, or permanent.

Serjeants and other Non-commissioned Officers, above the rank of Corporal shall be entitled to have their service as Serjeant reckoned as good-conduct service to enable them to add to the rate of their good-conduct pay, which, under the above provisions, they had acquired prior to promotion to Serjeant, and to carry the whole to increase their pension, whether temporary, or conditional, or permanent: Provided always that such pension, unless for wounds received in action, or in cases of total blindness, shall not exceed:—

Non-commissioned Officers and Privates, after completing twenty-one years' service in the Army, shall be entitled to pensions according to the following scales:—  
Privates 5d. to 1s. 3d. a day; the increase from the minimum shall be 1d. a day for every year of actual service completed beyond twenty-one years, and 1d. a day for each good-conduct badge in possession when discharged. The Serjeants, Clerks, and Corporals shall have their pension computed at the same rate as Privates, with the following addition for every year of service as a Non-commissioned Officer and Clerk:—

And for every year of actual service beyond 21 years, a Serjeant or Clerk of any of the above grades shall be entitled to receive 1*d.* a day, and the Corporal 1*d.* a day, but in no case is the aggregate amount of pension to exceed the maximum sum specified above.

#### ARMY HOSPITAL CORPS.

*Serjeant Majors.*—After 21 years' service, of which at least 5 in that rank, a permanent pension of 2*s.* a day, increasing to a maximum of 2*s.* 6*d.* at the rate of 2*d.* for each additional year's service, with the further additions of Good-Conduct Pay of which they may be in possession at the time of their discharge; and of 1*d.* a day for every 5 years' service as Non-commissioned Officer, but the maximum with such additions not to exceed 2*s.* a day.

1*d.* *Class Serjeants.*—After 21 years' total service, of which at least 5 in that rank, a permanent pension of 1*s.* 6*d.* a day, increasing to a maximum of 2*s.* 6*d.* a day, at the rate of 1*d.* for each additional year's service, with the further addition of Good-Conduct Pay of which they may be in possession at the time of their discharge; and of 1*d.* a day for every 5 years' service as Non-commissioned Officer, but the maximum with such additions not to exceed 2*s.* 6*d.* a day.

2*d.* *Class Serjeants.*—After 21 years' total service, of which at least 5 in that rank, a permanent pension of 1*s.* 3*d.* a day, increasing to a maximum of 2*s.* 6*d.* at the rate of 1*d.* a day for each additional year's service, with the further additions of the Good-Conduct Pay of which they may be in possession at the time of their discharge, and of 1*d.* a day for every 5 years' service as Non-commissioned Officer, but the maximum with such additions not to exceed 2*s.* a day.

*Privates.*—After 21 years' service, of which 16 years at least shall have been in this Corps, a permanent pension of 10*d.* a day, increasing to a maximum of 1*s.* 4*d.* at the rate of 1*d.* a day for each additional year's service, with the further addition of the Good-Conduct Pay of which they shall have been in uninterrupted possession for six months immediately preceding their discharge, but the maximum with such additions not to exceed 1*s.* 4*d.* a day.

#### TRAINED SCHOOLMASTERS.

After 21 years' service, during the last three years of which they shall have been in the receipt of the highest rate of pay, 3*s.* per diem.

After 21 years' service, and should they not have been uninterruptedly in the receipt of the highest rate of pay during the last three years, 2*s.* 6*d.* per diem.

In calculating the time of service of a Schoolmaster for pension, the whole of the period passed in the Training Schools of the Royal Military Asylum, as well as half of any former service in the Army, prior to his admission thereto, are to be deducted.

#### CORPS OF ARMOURER SERJEANTS.

The service of an Armourer Serjeant, whether with a Regiment, Battalion, or Corps of the regular Army, or Regiment of Embodied Militia, or in the Corps of Armourer Serjeants, at Millbank or elsewhere, shall be allowed to reckon as Serjeant's service towards claim to pension on discharge; and the service of the Staff Serjeant of Armourers shall be allowed to reckon as that of Serjeant Major.

#### COMMISSARIAT STAFF CORPS.

The periods of service and rules for reckoning such service, and the rates of pension of Non-commissioned Officers and Privates of this Corps, will be the same as those for Non-commissioned Officers and Privates of Infantry.

## RESERVE FORCE.

1. Any Person who, as a Non-commissioned Officer or Soldier, shall have completed the term of Service for which he was originally enlisted, not being less than 10 years in Infantry, or 12 in Cavalry, Artillery, or Engineers, or who, after 5 years Service, has been discharged for any cause other than Misconduct, without a permanent Pension, may, provided he is approved, and engages for such Service, be enrolled to serve in the Reserve Force, under the authority of the Act, in the margin, for such period as may be wanting to complete 21 years, if he originally enlisted in Infantry, or 24 years if he enlisted in Cavalry, Artillery, or Engineers, reckoning two years' Service in such Reserve Force as one towards the attainment of these several periods of Service, provided that such person shall be enrolled within 5 years after his discharge from the Army.

2. Till other arrangements are authorized, the persons composing this Reserve Force shall be attached during periods of Training and Exercise, or when called out for other purposes specified in the said Act, to any Infantry Regiment or Depot, or to the Enrolled Pensioner Force, whichever may, by the Secretary of State for War, be considered most convenient, and shall obey all Orders of the Officers or Non-commissioned Officers of such Regiment, Depot, or Enrolled Pensioner Force while so attached.

3. Every person thus enrolled shall be bound to register his place of abode in the Books of the Pension District in which he receives Enrolment Money, and to abide thereat, and not remove therefrom, without giving due notice; and the distance of his residence is not in any case, except by special authority, to exceed 30 miles from the Head Quarters of such Pension District.

4. All persons enrolled in this Reserve Force shall be bound to attend regular at the hour and place of assembly, when called out for Training and Exercise, either with the Regiment, Depot, or Pensioner Force to which they may have been attached as aforesaid, for a period not exceeding 12 days in each year, or at any time and place, when called on for the preservation of the public peace, or during such period as Her Majesty may require their services within the United Kingdom, in the event of invasion or eminent danger thereof, or in case of War; on all which occasions they will be under the command of the General Commanding-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Forces, and subject to the Articles of War.

5. All persons failing to attend on these occasions without reasonable cause, or when they have volunteered their services for permanent duty, or who may be convicted of any serious misconduct or breach of discipline while so employed, or of violence or disrespect at any time towards the Officers entrusted with their payment and superintendence, or who shall be guilty of any fraudulent statement at their enrolment, shall, in addition to any other penalty, be liable to dismissal from the Force, with the forfeiture wholly or in part of the several advantages specified herein.

6. On the termination of the period of Service for which these men have engaged in the Reserve Force, and on the fulfilment of the other conditions, they shall be entitled to the same rates of Pension as they would have attained by the warrants under which they originally enlisted, had they continued to serve in the Corps from which they were discharged till they completed the period of 21 and 24 years respectively, and they shall be permitted to add to such Pension an amount equal to the Good-Conduct Pay of which they had been in continuous receipt for two years immediately preceding the date of their discharge. Such Pension, however, shall in no case exceed Tenpence a day for a Private, One Shilling for a Corporal, or One Shilling and Threepence for a Serjeant or other superior Non-commissioned Officer, but except by special authority no Service shall be reckoned for any year in which the person enrolled has not resided at his registered place of abode, or has unlawfully absented himself during any portion of the exercise for which he shall have been called out in terms of the Act before referred to.

7. All persons enrolled in the Reserve Force who may be wounded or disabled in the execution of their duty, shall be entitled to the same Pension as, under similar circumstances and for the like service, would have been granted in the Regular Forces of Her Majesty, and when called out on permanent or continuous duty for any period exceeding Three months, the whole of such period shall be reckoned according to the usual Regulations of the Service, and not at the rate of two years for one.

8. The Staff Officer of the Pension District in which persons have been enrolled for this Reserve Force, or such other Officers as may be appointed for that purpose, shall keep a record of the number of days' Service performed by each person in the course of the year, as ascertained either from that Officer's own knowledge or the

report of the Commanding Officer of the Regiment or Depot with which such person may have been trained, and also of the extent of his Service prior to leaving his Regiment, so that he may be enabled to report to the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital when the right to Pension has been attained in each case; and the Officer or Officers by whom such person has been trained, shall also note on a Certificate to be given to him, whether the extent of Service which he was bound to perform up to the 1st of March in each year, has been regularly completed.

9. No person enrolled in the Reserve Force shall be compelled to serve in a grade lower than that which he last held in his Corps, but any interval which may take place in his Service while awaiting a vacancy shall not be allowed to reckon towards Pension. In the event, however, of such persons agreeing to serve in a lower grade till vacancies offer, they shall be entitled to reckon such Service towards the Pension of the higher grade after it has been attained.

10. The sum of £4 shall be allowed annually as Enrolment Money, which shall be issued to the persons composing the Reserve Force, in equal quarterly payments in advance on the 1st April, 1st July, 1st October, and 1st January, or at the period of being called out for training as may be considered most expedient by the Secretary of State for War; but before these payments, the Officer by whom they are made is to satisfy himself that each man is possessed of one pair of boots, two shirts, two pair of socks, and a stock, as also that all Fines for misconduct or absence during the previous training have been settled.

11. Every person in this Reserve Force shall receive a tunic, a pair of trousers, and a cap, on the first and each succeeding seventh year of his enrolment, and be entitled to the same rates of Pay and Allowances when called out for training, exercise, or service, as are fixed for corresponding ranks in the Infantry of the Line, with the addition of such amount of Good Conduct Pay as the enrolled man was in receipt of at the time of his discharge.

12. While serving with a Regiment or Depot all persons belonging to this Reserve Force shall be liable to the same punishments and penalties for offences as are prescribed by the Mutiny Act, and Articles of War for Her Majesty's other Forces; but, when serving with the Enrolled Pensioners, minor offences may be punished by the fines and penalties authorized by that Force.

#### REGIMENTAL SAVINGS BANKS.

To encourage habits of temperance and economy, and to enable the Soldier to make a further provision for his comfort on quitting the Service, the Regulations (War Office Circular, No. 711, dated 31st August, 1861) sanctioned by Her Majesty, afford him the readiest means of accumulating his savings, by authorizing the payment of interest at the rate of 3*l*. 15*s*. a year upon every hundred pounds, or of 9*d*. a year upon every pound sterling, deposited by him in the Military Savings Bank, provided the amount so deposited and interest shall not exceed 30*l*. in any one year, and 200*l*. in the whole. He may, however, make additional deposits on which interest will not be allowed.

The Soldier will receive from the Captain of his troop, company, battery, or detachment, every facility in depositing his savings, and in withdrawing his deposits in whole or in part.

Upon the discharge of a Soldier his deposits may remain in the Regimental Savings Bank at interest for a period not exceeding six months, after which, if the Soldier for his own

convenience requires it, the amount will be retained for him, but without interest.

Upon the death of a Soldier interest upon his deposits will cease, and the amount of principal and interest then due will be included in his non-effective account.

The Regimental Savings Bank having been established solely for the advantage of the Non-commissioned Officers and Soldiers of the Army, any money belonging to other persons, whether in military employ or not, which may be deposited by a Soldier in his own name, will be forfeited.

The money in deposit belonging to any Soldier who shall be convicted of desertion, or of felony, will also be forfeited.

#### ARTICLES OF WAR.

##### OBEDIENCE IS THE FIRST DUTY OF A SOLDIER.

For the following Offences the Articles of War inflict on the Soldier the penalty of *Death*, *Penal Servitude*, or such other punishment as a Court-martial may award:—

- Mutiny.
- Desertion.
- Cowardice.
- Holding Correspondence with the Enemy.
- Quitting his Post in search of Plunder.
- Personal violence to a Superior, or disobedience of his Lawful Commands.
- Forcing a Safe Guard.
- Betraying the Watchword.
- Giving false Alarms.
- Casting away Arms or Ammunition.
- Sleeping on, or quitting his Post.

A Soldier if convicted of Desertion or Felony, forfeits his Claim to reckon his previous service towards *Additional Pay* while serving and to *Pension on Discharge*.

A Soldier embezzling or fraudulently misapplying Money or Stores, is liable to *Penal Servitude*.

For the following Offences a Soldier is liable to be punished



by *Imprisonment*, with or without Hard Labour, and by Solitary Confinement during a Portion of such Imprisonment, or by *Corporal Punishment*, and, in addition to any other Punishment, by Forfeiture of *Additional Pay* whilst serving, and of all claim to *Pension on Discharge*.

Using traitorous words against the Queen or Royal Family.

Persuading to desert, or harbouring a Deserter.

Being Drunk on Duty.

Breaking Arrest.

Giving a different Watchword.

Spreading false reports in the Field.

In Action, or previous to Action, using words tending to create alarm.

Quitting Ranks without leave.

Being made Prisoner by neglect.

Seizing Supplies.

*Disgraceful and vicious Conduct*.

Refusing Assistance to, or impeding, the Provost Marshal.

Embezzling or misapplying Money or Stores.

For the following Offences, a Soldier is to be punished according to the nature and degree of the offence.

Speaking to the Hurt or Dishonour of the General, or other Commander-in-Chief of the Forces.

Neglect of Orders on Duty.

Hiring another person to do his Duty without authority.

Absence from Parade.

Giving false Alarms at home by discharging Fire-arms, &c.

Lying out of Quarters.

Being found One Mile from the Camp without leave.

Permitting Baggage Waggons or Carriages to be overloaded.

Selling, losing, or spoiling his Arms, Accoutrements, or Necessaries.

Selling, losing, or ill-treating his Horse.

Committing waste, or destroying Property.

Non-commissioned Officer striking or ill-treating a Soldier.

Vexatious appeal from a Regimental Court-martial.

A Soldier absenting himself without leave, or placed in confinement for a period not exceeding seven days, though not brought by his Commanding Officer to a Court-martial for the Offence, nevertheless forfeits his Pay for the period of such absence or confinement.

Any Non-commissioned Officer, or Soldier, convicted of embezzling or misapplying Money entrusted to him, is to be put under Stoppages till the Money is made good.

A Soldier convicted of malingering, of feigning or producing disease, of injuring his health by vice or intemperance, of absenting himself from Hospital whilst under medical treatment, or of a gross violation of the rules of the Hospital, may be tried for *Disgraceful Conduct*, and shall be subjected to the pains and penalties attached to that offence; and a Soldier convicted of *Disgraceful Conduct*, if sentenced to forfeit all Claim to Pension, will further be liable to be discharged with ignominy.

A Soldier who shall become maimed or mutilated by the firing off of his musket, or by any other means, is to be tried by a Court-martial, and if it be found by the Court that the maiming or mutilating was the effect of design, he shall not be discharged, but shall be employed on Military work. If a Soldier tamper with his eyes, or by vice, intemperance, or misconduct, shall cause the total or partial loss of his sight, he shall not be entitled to his discharge, or to a pension, but shall be detained in an Eye Infirmary.

A Soldier convicted of having been four times drunk within twelve months, or twice drunk when for parade or duty within twelve months, may be deprived of his *Additional Pay*, or of the allowance in lieu of Beer, for a period not exceeding two years.

Any Person having been discharged from the Army, who shall re-enlist, and when questioned by the Magistrate, at the time of being attested, shall conceal or misrepresent the cause of his Discharge, shall not reckon his past service, nor be allowed a Pension, if again discharged for Disability.

All Crimes not Capital, and all Disorders and Neglects which Soldiers may be guilty of to the prejudice of Military Discipline, though not specified in the Articles of War, are to

be taken cognizance of by Courts-martial, and punished according to the nature and degree of the offence.

But Soldiers who by conviction of Desertion or of Felony have forfeited their claim to reckon Service for Good Conduct Pay, Honorary Marks of Distinction, and Pensions, may after a long course of subsequent good conduct be recommended by their Commanding Officer for the restoration of such Claim.

#### COMPLAINTS.

When a Soldier has any complaint to make, he should appeal to the Captain of his Company; his tone and manner should be temperate and respectful; and he should be accompanied by a Non-commissioned Officer, if possible, of his own Company. No Soldier, on any account, is to presume to make a complaint to his Officer for another Soldier, who conceives he is aggrieved; and not more than two Soldiers should approach the Officer to make a complaint at one and the same time.

When a Soldier dies *without leaving a Will*, his effects are apportioned and paid to his surviving Relatives in the nearest degree, in the order above stated, according to the Statute of Distributions; and the Soldier should understand that the insertion of a name in the above Form is not enough to give a title to any part of his effects, unless allowed by the Statute. If the Soldier desires to bequeath his effects otherwise than according to the Statute of Distributions, he should take care to *make his Will*, stating to whom he desires his effects to be given or paid. To ensure that this may be done in a legal manner, Forms of Wills, to be used according to circumstances, are given in the following pages; but these Forms are in no case to be filled up, they are to serve as Models for the Will, to be prepared by or at the instance of the Soldier, on a separate sheet of Paper. Whatever the nature or extent of the bequests, the Forms in regard to names, descriptions, and addresses, and of the attestation and declaration of the Will, are to be fully completed, according to the printed Forms supplied to the Regiment.

## GENERAL RULES AS TO WILLS.

1. The Testator must be of the age of twenty-one years.
2. The Will must be in writing, and signed by the Testator with his name, or, if he cannot write, with his mark, in the presence of two witnesses, who must be present together; and the Will must be made, acknowledged, and attested in the presence of all three.
3. A person to whom money, &c., is left by the Will should not be an attesting Witness, for the gift would not be good.
4. A Will is revoked by the marriage of the Testator, and therefore a new Will ought to be made after marriage, if desired.
5. If any alteration is made in the writing of a Will, the signature of the Testator and of the Witnesses ought to be made in the margin or other part of the Will, opposite to or near such alteration, or at the foot or end of, or opposite to, a Memorandum referring to such alteration, and written at the end or some other part of the Will.
6. But an alteration or addition may be made by a *Codicil* (that is to say, by an addition to the Will), executed and witnessed in the same way as the Will.
