All present members of the Army Nursing Service, and members of the Army Nursing Reserve who have been in military employment during the war in South Africa, shall be eligible for appointment in the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service, if recommended by the Nursing Board. In cases before the Civil Courts the allowances to be given to a professional witness would depend on the purpose for which his evidence would be required. If he came for the purpose of giving a professional opinion, that is to say, as an expert, £5-5/- would be the usual charge. If, on the contrary he came merely for the purpose of stating facts within his knowledge there is no definite charge, but £2-2-0 would, I think, be a fair charge in this case. It must be remembered, however, that in the case of a court of law a witness can be compelled to attend on payment of his reasonable expenses, whereas so far as I know in the case of a court of enquiry his attendance is purely voluntary and any loss of business that he has incurred would fairly be taken into account in determining how much he should be paid which would not be the case in the case of a witness called before a court of law.
