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
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

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS.

THE principal objects for which a Soldier is required to be in possession of this Book are to secure to him, whilst in the Army, a proper settlement of his Pay, Allowances, and Clothing, and that he may have a Record, establishing his claim to any benefits to which he may be entitled under Her Majesty's Regulations for granting Pensions, Allowances, and Gratuities to discharged Soldiers, who have performed good and faithful Service, and to assist in the disposal of his effects, in the event of his dying intestate.

It is therefore the Soldier's interest to take care that his Book is at all times correctly and completely kept.

When a Soldier is discharged, he is to take his Book away with him; in the event of a Soldier dying in the Service, his Book will be forwarded to his relations or representatives, if they desire it; and if it contain a record of Wounds received in action, or of distinguished acts of Bravery, it will remain an honourable memorial of his character and conduct.

REGIMENTAL SAVINGS' BANKS.

To encourage habits of temperance and economy, and to enable the Soldier to make a further provision for his comfort on quitting the Service, the Regulations (Clauses 41, Army Circulars, 1883) sanctioned by Her Majesty afford him the readiest means of accumulating his savings, by authorising the payment of interest at the rate of £3 15s. a year upon every hundred pounds, or of 9d. a year upon every pound sterling, deposited by him in the Military Savings' Bank, provided the amount so deposited and interest shall not exceed £30 in any one year, and £200 in the whole. He may, however, make additional deposits on which interest will not be allowed.

The Soldier will receive from the Captain of his squadron, troop, company, battery, or detachment, every facility in depositing his savings, and in withdrawing his deposits in whole or in part.

Upon the discharge of a Soldier his deposits may remain in the Regimental Savings' Bank at interest for a period not exceeding six months, after which, if the Soldier for his own convenience requires it, the amount will be retained for him, but without interest.

Upon the death of a Soldier interest upon his deposits will cease, and the amount of principal and interest then due will be included in his noneffective account.

The Regimental Savings' Bank having been established solely for the advantage of the Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers of the Army, any money belonging to other persons, whether in Military employ or not, which may be deposited by a Soldier in his own name, will be forfeited.

The money in deposit belonging to any Soldier who shall be convicted of desertion will also be forfeited.

COMPLAINTS.

When a Soldier has any complaint to make, he should appeal to the Captain of his Company; his tone and manner should be temperate and respectful; and he should be accompanied by a Non-commissioned Officer, if possible, of his own Company. No Soldier, on any account, is to presume to make a complaint to his Officer for another Soldier, who conceives he is aggrieved; and not more than two Soldiers should approach the Officer to make a complaint at one and the same time.

CIVIL EMPLOYMENT ON DISCHARGE OR TRANSFER TO THE RESERVE.

Government Employment.—With the view of affording Government employment to deserving Soldiers, the Postmaster-General has decided that vacancies among the rural and provincial town postmen, and also among the auxiliary postmen in London, are in future to be offered in the first instance to discharged Soldiers and Army Reserve men. Candidates for such employment must have good characters on leaving the Colours, and not less than three years' service. The ranks of the Metropolitan, County, and Borough Police are to a great extent filled by old Soldiers, and regular employment is also provided for many old Soldiers in the Royal Arsenal, the Army Clothing Department, the Ordnance Store Department, and other Government Departments.

Employment by Railway Companies.—Employment for deserving Soldiers is likewise afforded by many of the Railway Companies, and in the Corps of Commissionaires.

A Register for Civil Employment is kept in all Regimental Districts, with a view of assisting men of good character to obtain employment in Civil life when discharged from the Army, or transferred to the Army Reserve on the expiration of their engagement.

It must, however, be clearly understood by every man registering his name therein, that no guarantee is thereby afforded that Civil employment will be obtained for him.

The entry may be made at any time within one year before, or immediately succeeding, the discharge or transfer. The application of a man serving with the Colours to have his name registered will be made through his Commanding Officer; that of an Army Reserve man, or of a discharged Soldier direct to the Officer keeping the register for the district in which he resides.

The National Association for the Employment of Reserve and Discharged Soldiers has also been established for the purpose of introducing to employers of labour Soldiers of *reliable* character on their discharge or transfer to the Reserve.

The Central Office of the Association is at 12, Buckingham Street, Strand, London, and there are Branches at several large towns. Men of the following classes are registered for employment without fee, viz. :—Attendants, Carmen, Caretakers, Clerks, Conductors, Collectors, Grooms, Messengers, Porters, Musicians, Policemen, Night Watchmen, Timekeepers, Labourers, Servants, &c., &c.

MARRIAGE.

A Soldier must not marry without first obtaining his Commanding Officer's written sanction, otherwise he can never have any claim to be borne on the married establishment of his Corps.

A large proportion of Staff and Regimental Serjeants is allowed on the married roll, also 4 per cent. of the Trumpeters, Drummers, and Rank and File who have completed Seven Years' Service and are in possession of at least one good conduct badge. When a regiment goes to India the proportion of married men permitted to embark is increased.

PARTICULARS REGARDING THE DUKE OF YORK'S ROYAL MILITARY SCHOOL,

LONDON.

I. The Duke of York's Royal Military School was founded in 1804, by H.R.H. the late Duke of York, for the free education of soldiers' orphans.

II. The benefits of the institution are open to the sons of non-commissioned officers and men who have deserved well of their country, for long, faithful, or gallant service, or who have died in the performance of their duty, or have been discharged from the army, from any cause not affecting their character.

III. Candidates for admission must be not less than 10, and not more than 12 years of age, at the time the application is made on their behalf, and free from any mental defect or infirmity.

IV. In registering applications for admission, the cases are classified as follows :---

Class A.-Boys who have lost both parents.

- ,, B.-Boys who have lost their father.
- ",, B2.—Boys whose father is alive, but absent on foreign service.
- ,, C.-Boys who have lost their mother.

V. The merit of the father, in respect of character and service, is always an important consideration in weighing the claims of the candidate.

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SOLDIERS' WILLS.

1. The particulars of the next-of-kin should always be carefully inserted in the foregoing form, but the Soldier must understand that the entry of the particulars of next-of-kin does not relieve him from the necessity of making a Will. The entry in question has no legal effect, and unless a Soldier duly makes a Will, his estate is dealt with as if he had died intestate, and the person intended to be benefited may receive little or no share in the distribution.

2. The Soldier's Will should be made out either on one of the separate Forms provided for that purpose, or on the Form as contained in the Pocket Ledger, or on a separate sheet of paper to be kept folded in his Pocket Ledger.

3. The bequests in the Will may be varied according to the circumstances and wishes of each Soldier; but the form of attestation, and the general outline of the Will, as shown in the following Forms, are to be carefully preserved.

4. The Will must be in writing, and signed by the Testator with his name, or, if he cannot write, with his mark, in the presence of two Witnesses, who must be present together; and the Will must be made, acknowledged, and attested in the presence of all three.

5. A person to whom money, &c., is left by the Will should not be an attesting Witness, for the gift would not be good.

6. A Will is revoked by the marriage of the Testator, and therefore a new Will ought to be made after marriage, if desired.

7. If any alteration is made in the writing of a Will, the signature of the Testator and the Witnesses ought to be made in the margin or other part of the Will, opposite to or near such alteration, or at the foot or end of, or opposite to a Memorandum referring to such alteration, and written at the end or some other part of the Will.

8. But an alteration or addition may be made by a *Codicil* (that is to say, by an addition to the Will), executed and witnessed in the same way as the Will.

9. When engaged in actual warfare, a Soldier would do well (where circumstances do not allow of these Forms being used) to record his Will in writing, or declare the same orally in the presence of Witnessus.

N.B.—The Testator must be of the age of 21 years unless he is on actual Military Service.

OBEDIENCE IS THE FIRST DUTY OF A SOLDIER.

NOTES FROM ARMY ACT.

For the following offences a Soldier is liable, at all times, to the penalty of death, or of any less punishment :--

Shamefully abandoning a post.

Shamefully casting away his arms, ammunition, or tools in the presence of the enemy.

Treacherously holding correspondence with or assisting the enemy. Harbouring or voluntarily serving with the enemy.

Doing anything to imperil the success of Her Majesty's Forces. Cowardice before the enemy.

Mutiny.

Personal violence to a superior, or disobedience to his lawful commands when in the execution of his office.

Deserting, attempting to desert, or assisting or persuading any other person to desert.—(N.B.—A Soldier under orders for Active Service, who deserts or attempts to desert, is liable to the penalty of death.)

Leaving his Commanding Officer, or breaking into any house in search of plunder.

Leaving his guard, picquet, patrol, or post without orders.

Forcing a safeguard or sentry.

Impeding, or when called on refusing to assist, the Provost Marshal or any of his assistants.

Doing violence to a person bringing supplies to the Forces, or detaining stores proceeding to the Forces, or committing any offence against the property or person of any inhabitant of, or resident in, the county in which he is serving.

Intentionally occasioning false alarms, or treacherously giving up the countersign.

When a sentry, sleeping or being drunk on his post, or leaving his post without orders.

Penal servitude, or any less punishment under all conditions of service, may be awarded for the following offences :---

Deserting for the second or any subsequent time.

Fraudulent Enlistment for the second or subsequent offence.

Stealing or embezzling any public money or goods. When in command of a picquet or guard, releasing a prisoner without due authority.

Wilfully allowing a prisoner to escape.

On Active Service, penal servitude or any less punishment may be awarded if a Soldier is found guilty of—

Leaving the ranks without orders. Wilfully destroying or damaging property. Being taken prisoner through neglect. Creating alarm or despondency.

Striking or offering violence to, or using threatening or insubordinate language to, or disobeying the order of a Superior.

All other offences, including any act to the prejudice of good order and Military discipline not specially mentioned, may be punished by imprisonment depending on the nature and degree of the offence.

The following are some of the graver offences of this class :----

Traitorous words regarding the Sovereign.

Malingering or feigning disease.

Wilfully maiming himself or any other Soldier.

Aggravating or delaying the cure of disease.

Stealing or embezzling the property of a comrade or Officer.

Disgraceful conduct of a cruel, indecent, or unnatural kind.

Drunkenness on duty or not on duty.

Resisting an escort.

Breaking out of barracks.

Neglecting to obey orders.

Breaking arrest or escaping from confinement.

Absence without leave.

Making away with, or losing by neglect, articles of equipment, clothing, or necessaries.

Wilfully injuring any property belonging to a comrade, or to an Officer, or to any regimental mess or band, or to any regimental institutions, or any public property.

or any public property. Illtreating any horse used in the public service.

Making a false accusation against any other Soldier or Officer. Refusing to answer questions when a witness before a Court Martial. Being guilty of contempt of court, or giving false evidence on oath. Enlisting after having been discharged with disgrace.

On Active Service a Soldier drunk on the line of march, or otherwise on duty, or after being warned for duty, or when required for duty, or guilty of malingering, stealing, or of any other disgraceful conduct, or of any offence punishable with death or penal servitude, may be awarded summary punishment of the character of personal restraint or of hard labour.

PENAL STOPPAGES FROM ORDINARY PAY.

A Soldier is liable to forfeiture of pay as follows :--


All ordinary pay for every day of absence either on desertion or without leave, or as prisoner of war, and for every day of imprisonment either under sentence for an offence awarded by a civil court or court-martial, or by his Commanding Officer, or if he is on board one of Her Majesty's ships, by the Commanding Officer of that ship, or under detention on the charge for an offence of which he is afterwards convicted by a civil court or court-martial, or under detention on the charge for absence without leave for which he is afterwards awarded imprisonment by his Commanding Officer, or under detention when he shall confess to have been guilty of desertion or fraudulent enlistment, and the forfeiture during the period of such detention shall have been ordered by the competent military authority.


All ordinary pay for every day on which he is in hospital on account of sickness certified by the proper Medical Officer attending on him at the hospital to have been caused by an offence under the Army Act committed by him.

A Soldier ordered by his Commanding Officer to suffer imprisonment, or pay a fine, or to suffer any deduction from his ordinary pay [as a punishment] has a right, if he so request, to be tried by a district court-martial instead of submitting to such imprisonment, fine, or deduction.

MODE OF COMPLAINT BY SOLDIER.

If any Soldier thinks himself wronged in any matter by any Officer other than his Captain, or by any Soldier, he may complain thereof to his Captain, and if he thinks himself wronged by his Captain, either in respect of his complaint not being redressed or in respect of any other matter, he may complain thereof to his Commanding Officer, and if he thinks himself wronged by his Commanding Officer, either in respect of his complaint not being redressed or in respect of any other matter, he may complain thereof to the General or other Officer commanding the district or station where the Soldier is serving; and every Officer to whom a complaint is made in pursuance of this section shall cause such complaint to be inquired into, and shall, if on enquiry he is satisfied of the justice of the complaint so made, take such steps as may be necessary for giving full redress to the complainant in respect of the matter complained of.

RECRUITING AGENTS.

Discharged Soldiers and Army Reserve men may be employed as Recruiting Agents without being officially appointed as such. Recruiting Agents are not qualified to serve Notice Papers or to prepare the Attestations of Recruits.

Recruiting Rewards will not be paid for

- (a) Boys under 17 years of age.
- (b) Re-enlisted Pensioners.
- (c) Recruits for the Armourer Section and the Machinery Artificer Section of the Army Ordnance Corps.

Recruiting Rewards will be paid to Recruiting Agents for each Recruit raised and finally approved for the Regular Army or the Militia, at the following rates, viz. :-

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In the case of Recruits	raised by	Recruit	ing Agen	nts at "	out-stat	ions," the	rewards	will

be 4s. Od. instead of 2s. 6d. The sum of 1s. Od. will be deducted from the rates specified above when the Recruit belongs to the Militia and enlists in the Regular Army during his preliminary drill, drill on


CIVIL EMPLOYMENT.

Applications for Registry should be made to the Officer Commanding the Regimental District within one year of Discharge or transfer to the Reserve.

Civil Employment.

A Register for civil employment is kep at the Head Qrs. of Regimental and Recruiting Districts, in which are entered the name, of men of good character discharged or transferred to the Army Reserve, who reside is the Regimental District. Enlistment into Section D., 1st class Army Reserve.

Men who have been discharged on termination of their first period of limited engagement, from any arm of the Service may be enlisted for Sec. D., 1st Class A.R., for four years, within two years from the date of their discharge. Cavalry men will be enlisted on the understanding that, on mobilization, they will be liable for employment as officers' grooms, or as drivers, either in the Cavalry or in any other arm of the Service. In the case of Infantry or Artillery Reserve, men discharged with characters other than "Bad" or "Very Bad" will be eligible for enlistment. In other arms of the Service only those will be eligible who received at least a "Good" character on discharge.

Re-enlistment in the Militia.

Men discharged from the Army with not less than three years' service can re-enlist in the Militia of the County in which they reside on advantageous conditions, which will be communicated to them by the Adjutant on application.
