Insurance. When despatching please insure against breakage in transit with the Railway Company or Carrying Agency to whom you have entrusted the goods.

Charges Upon despatch of Curios please post the enclosed card, advising us of consignment, and stating the expenses incurred, which shall be duly refunded.
