From the 25th of January 1914
I visited 9 Villages in search
of old Surgical Instruments
and other Articles but with
ill success. But on visiting
the 10th Village I was suddenly
attacked of Cholera I was
detained in the Village for the
past 2 days. Meanwhile
I shall by my utmost
efforts obtain some old Articles
for your Medical Museum
You need not be anxious
about it - owing to my

late illness I was unable
to reply and acknowledge
your letter of the 17 Dec 1913.

Kindly excuse. In my
next letter I shall inform
you about my Vacki to the
other villages in such of
Articles. The one pound (of
Rs 16) which you very kindly
sent me for the Cartage
has been spent for Trainage
and Cartage to and from.

The next trips will be
made on my own accounts

Dear Sir,

I desire to thank you for your kind letter of November 26 and am pleased to know you were interested in the account of the opening ceremony of the Historical Medical Museum.

We should much like to have as many contributions from India as possible especially in connection with native medicine and treatment. We shall be very willing to reimburse you for any moderate sum you may expend in acquiring these and curious instruments, charms or talismans, or any other objects connected with medicine for the Museum. As you state if we send you £1., you will be able to travel to the heart of the villages and purchase charms and other articles, we are sending you a bank draft herewith for that amount, and should be glad if you would kindly do your best and render us an account for the sum, sending anything you purchase direct to the above address. Old coins are of no use to us; the objects we require are those used in healing, especially by native practitioners, such as appliances, instruments and other objects connected with medicine and pharmacy.
