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

If you will kindly send it on to me addressed to 67, Holborn Viaduct London, E.C., I will get a friend of mine, who is a Chinese scholar, to look at it, and if it turns out to be what you think - a notice board connected with a hospital or medicine of any kind - I should be pleased to keep it and forward you a Postal Order for 7/6 (seven shillings and sixpence). If not, I will return it to you and pay the carriage both ways so that you will be at no expense in the matter in any case.

I should think it would come quite safely wrapped in brown paper per parcels post.


