Dear Sir!

In reply to your letter I can inform you that we have insured the Cast by a Company in the Hague, which only secures things against loss not against damage. The amount of the Costs of the Cast and the emballage is 40 guilders Dutch. For the expedition we have payed 6.49 guilders Dutch. The total amount, you have to pay is 46.49 guilders Dutch.

I can give you the following description of the Cast:

Sitting statue of the chief physician Autes, dressed in a shirt and in an apron, at the feet sandals. In the left hand an uncertain object perhaps a spade? On the forehead the following inscription:

„All what Comes on the offering-

Stable of Phak-sokar-Osiris is for the
"Ka of the royal scribe and Chief-phy-

Behind the following Inscription
"In offering which the king gives, Phak-
"sokar-Osiris, the first of the West, may
"he give bread, water, fresh air, wine
"milk, all pure and good things,
"Gifts, flowers, so drink the water
"from the source of the river (the Nile)
"for the Ka of the royal scribe and the
"Chief physician Autar, of the land of the two lands.
The statue belongs to the 19th Dynasty
(± 1350-1205 B.C.).

The finding place is unknown. It
has been bought by the Museum from
the Collection D. J. d'Anastasy in 1828.

These are the informations I can give you.
