Dear Sir,

It is with regret that we learn from your letter of the 20th inst. that the Hanwell Asylum Sub-Committee do not see their way to allow us to have copies made of the old instruments of restraint, which they kindly lent to the Historical Medical Museum.

During the time the Museum was open last year these instruments excited great interest among specialists in mental diseases, especially as they were shown in comparison with others that were lent from Old Bedlam and other London Asylums.

May I ask you to point out to your Committee that the real interest of such relics is only brought out when they are exhibited with others of a similar nature to show the advance that has been made in medical treatment during the past centuries.

I may further state that this Museum is strictly professional in character and is not open to the public, all the objects exhibited being of a purely scientific nature.

If your Committee are unable to re-consider their decision on the matter of allowing us to have copies made, will they be so
