Dear Sir,

Your letter has been
misplaced. Since the delay
in answering it, I send
you herewith a curious
and old instrument in the
shape of a mechanically
worked lance which a
patient gave to me a
short while ago. There
is a cross key to pull
over the spring into position
after the trigger has been
pulled out. The pressure

on the trigger release the
spring when the lance
point strikes and forces
the sword out and back
again. I do not suppose
your musket contains
an instrument like it.
