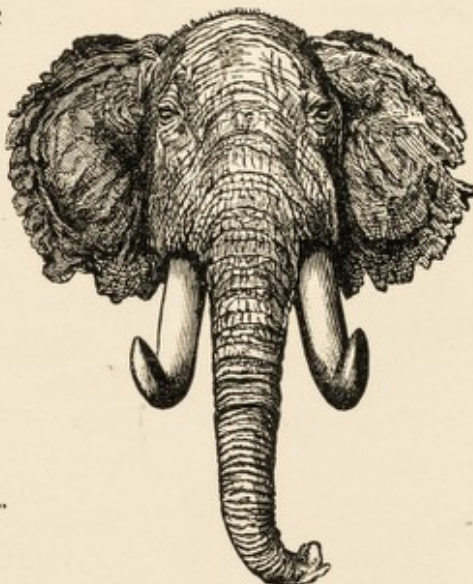

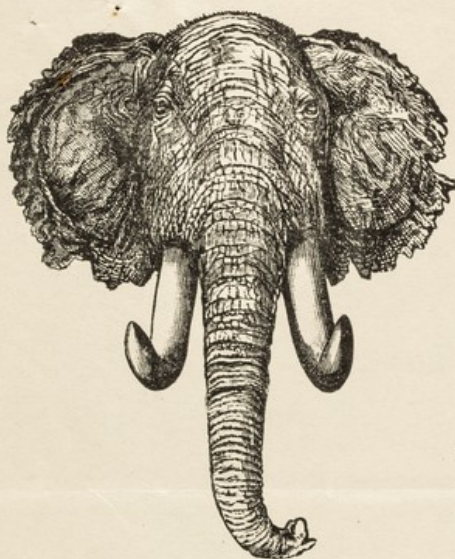

Early last year you supplied us with a specimen of the *Coluber longissimus* (*Aesculapii*). Would it be possible for you to mount this for us as follows; we should like it entwined round a rugged perpendiculer staff, about 16 inches long, to represent the wand of Aesculapius. The staff should be from $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 inches in diameter, tapering towards the top, with the bark on. We enclose you a rough sketch, from a Greek marble, showing the appearance of the emblem. If you can arrange the snake so entwined, we will do the mounting which we want for a special purpose.

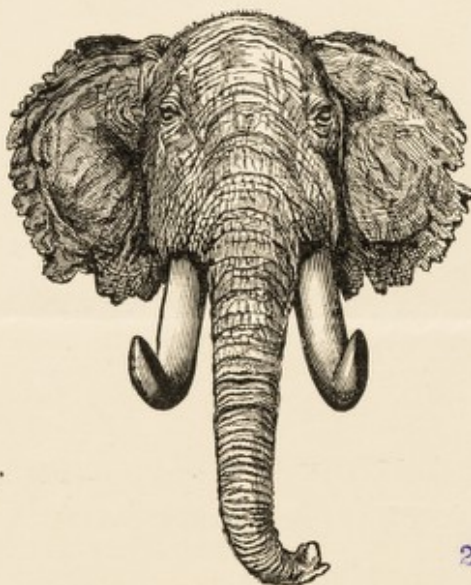

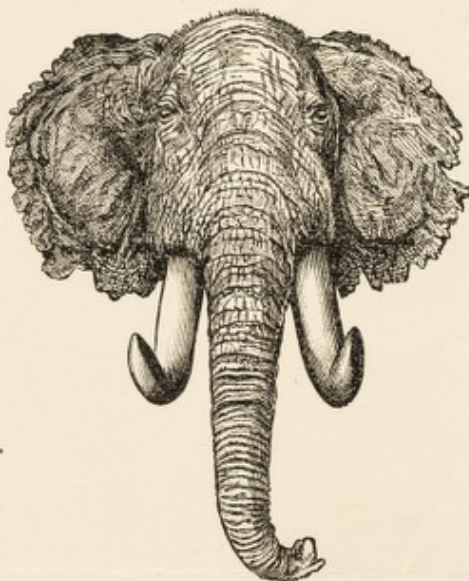
